From the Desk of President Argiris

On Sunday, November 24, Wheeling hosted its annual holiday lighting event, Lights Around Wheeling. This was a special event for our residents and I thank all those who braved the cold to visit with Santa and celebrate the annual ushering in of the holiday season. I'd like to give a special thank-you to State Senator Julie Morrison and State Representatives Carol Sente and Elaine Nekritz for coming to Wheeling to celebrate the season with us. A truly wonderful time was had by all!

There is a lot of good news to report from the first six months of my term, and I'd like to share it with you. I and the Board of Trustees are strongly committed to making Wheeling a great place to live and do business. Our Village is home to over 800 licensed businesses from over 50 different industries and business sectors, and we continue to outperform the region in several key areas. Our unemployment rate, which has been lower than state and regional rates for decades, just decreased even further, from 8% in June to 7% in the fall. Even as we've seen an overall increase in retail vacancies in the Chicago area, Wheeling's rate has declined. And the vacant proportion of our 14 million square feet of industrial space remains well below the regional average. Last year, retail sales by Wheeling businesses surpassed \$503 million, and this year's sales are even stronger, up overall by nearly 15%. That number reflects an 8% increase in restaurant sales and a 26% increase in general merchandise sales. Hotel performance also remains strong, with occupancies over 70%.

The development community has taken notice of the opportunities here, as several upcoming projects indicate. Our longstanding vision of a vibrant downtown continues to take shape, as the Village has secured over \$150 million in new projects for the center of town. First among those is Wheeling Town Center, a transit-oriented, mixed-use development that will transform the former Wickes site into a dynamic downtown featuring nearly 300 luxury apartments, as well as restaurant, retail, entertainment, and recreation uses. These will be situated around a Village Greenway, which will serve as a community gathering place and a setting for public events like farmers markets, art fairs, and festivals.

Another major building block for the center of town came into place when the Village Board unanimously approved the Northgate Crossings development in August, which will add 288 high-end residential units to the downtown district. These two projects will dovetail with other significant improvements in the heart of town.

The \$38 million reconstruction of Heritage Park—a partnership between MWRD and the Park District, with the assistance of the Village—is on target to be completed in April. Once completed, this renovation will feature new entry plazas and a new Wolf Road entrance, more conveniently-located parking, a bandshell with natural amphitheater seating, a pavilion with a lake overlook, walking paths looping the entire park, basketball and tennis courts, a new playground, and a new athletic complex that includes three artificial-turf baseball fields, one football/soccer/baseball field, and a centrally-located concession building with restrooms. In addition to these amenities that will complement the existing Recreation Center and Aquatic Center, the project also provides downstream flood relief and compensatory stormwater storage for new development. Portions of this project that are at or near completion include the north parking lot, the pedestrian bridge, the vehicular bridge leading to the south parking lot, the creek relocation, the concession building, construction of asphalt paths and pathway lighting, and the surfacing, lighting, fencing, curbing, and scoreboards of the athletic field. This renovated state-of-the-art park facility will be among the largest in the region, and will attract thousands of visitors per year.

There's plenty of good news elsewhere in town, too. Up at the Westin, the new owners of the Prairie Crossings shopping center have been actively marketing the available space and already have several new retailers signing on, including Spears Bourbon, Burgers & Beer, a 5,000-square-foot restaurant featuring live entertainment. And Saranello's soon plans to open a dedicated banquet facility for weddings, corporate parties, and other events. On Lake Cook Road, construction is underway in Lexington Commons on a structure that is expected to include a second Wheeling Starbucks. And on Restaurant Row, our Economic Development staff continues to work with restaurant users interested in the former Le Francais and Don Roth's sites, as well as the Village-owned site north of Tuscany.

Wheeling Board of Health Activities for 2014

The 2014 Wheeling Community Blood Drives will be held March 12, July 9, and November 12 from 2–7 p.m. on the first floor of Village Hall. Please come in and donate. Each pint of blood saves three lives! During Wheeling Blood Drives in 2013, 144 units of blood were collected; your donations helped to save 432 lives! Thank you to all the residents who donated.

The Prescription Medication Collection will continue to be held on the third Saturday of every month from 10 a.m. until 12 p.m. in front of the Police Station at 1 Community Blvd. Acceptable items include:

- Prescription and over-the-counter medications in their original containers. No liquid over-the-counter medications will be accepted. We cannot accept any controlled substances.
- Sharps (needles and syringes) in rigid containers with sealed lids. We will not accept sharps that are not in a rigid container. Sharps containers will be handed out at the collection and are available at the Community Development Department.
- Household batteries (AA, AAA, C, D, 9V) and rechargeable batteries (Lithium NiMh, NiCad). No automotive batteries will be accepted. Each rechargeable battery MUST have masking tape on contact points or be contained in an individual self-locking plastic bag.
- Eyeglasses, including sunglasses and telescopic, magnifying, and prescription glasses. Children's glasses are especially needed. The glasses will be given to the Lions Club "Recycle for Sight" program.

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT & PUBLIC WORKS

Snow Season Procedures

The Public Works Department is responsible for clearing and de-icing arterial roads and residential streets, as well as public sidewalks, bus stop shelters, the Metra station, and Village-owned buildings. Public Works is not responsible for county or state roadways. County roads include Lake Cook Road, Buffalo Grove Road, Schoenbeck Road, Hintz Road, and Aptakisic Road (call 847.827.1164). State roads include Elmhurst Road (Route 83), Dundee Road, Milwaukee Avenue, Palatine Road, McHenry Road, and Wolf Road (Manchester north to Milwaukee Avenue and Marquardt south to Camp McDonald Road) (call 847.705.4222).

During the snow season residents are advised of the following:

- *For safety, please maintain a distance of 100 feet or more when driving behind a snow plow or salt truck.
- *Please shovel snow away from fire hydrants so they can be accessible in case of emergencies.
- *Please do not place refuse or recycling containers in the street.

Parking Restrictions

*Do not park vehicles on any street in the Village within eight hours after a snowfall of two inches or more (per Village Code 9.10.103). This allows streets to be plowed accordingly by Public Works. Vehicles in violation will be towed.

Sidewalk Requirements

*Residents and property owners are responsible for clearing snow and ice from sidewalks adjoining or adjacent to their property whenever there is a snowfall, and by 10 a.m. on every morning thereafter. If the snow and ice is frozen, owners are responsible for spreading the areas with sand, sawdust, salt, or other substances made for the purpose of melting snow and ice (Village Code 11.16.010).

*Snow or ice shall not be deposited into any street, road, or highway, or along the shoulder or edge of any street, road, or highway within the Village (Village Code 11.16.040). Please deposit snow and ice from sidewalks and driveways onto the parkway.


*Residents and property owners who are in violation may be penalized.

Holiday Recycling Programs

Christmas Tree Recycling

Non-artificial holiday trees will be collected at residential curbsides during the first two weeks in January at no additional charge. All decorations, stands, etc. must be removed from trees in order to be collected. Please do not place trees in plastic bags. Trees that have decorations or are in stands or plastic tree bags will not be collected.




Holiday Lights Recycling

Through the Holiday Lights Recycling Program, sponsored by the Solid Waste Agency of Northern Cook County (SWANCC) and Elgin Recycling (www.elginrecycling.com), residents can recycle holiday mini-lights, C7 lights, C9 lights, rope lights, LED lights, and extension cords. All colors and lengths will be collected at the Department of Public Works, 77 W. Hintz Road, Monday through Friday from 7 a.m. to 3 p.m.. Garland, live greens, wreaths, and other non-recyclables are not accepted in this recycling program. Residents may call 847.279.6900 with any questions. The program concludes February 28, 2014.



Snow Shoveling Guidelines

When shoveling the end of the driveway near the street, place the snow to the right of the driveway (as you face the street). If it is piled on the other side, it is more likely to be pushed into the driveway when the streets are being plowed. Also, clear a few feet of the edge of the street and curb to the left of the driveway. This creates a pocket for the snow to spill into and will help reduce the amount of snow at the end of the driveway. Refer to the illustration below.



Ambulance Usage: When to call and when not to call



Each year, the Wheeling Fire Department responds to approximately 4,500 emergency calls. Of these, approximately 3,000 are reports of emergency medical situations. Unfortunately, the Department occasionally receives calls for minor health problems that do not require immediate response. Ambulance service is intended to be an emergency medical service only, and not an expedient replacement for routine medical care or treatment easily obtained from a personal physician or regional health clinic. Non-essential calls for service potentially delay assistance to individuals who truly need an ambulance, result in backups at emergency rooms, and can result in hundreds of dollars in unnecessary medical bills that may not be covered by health insurance or Medicaid.

So, when should you call for an ambulance? The following general guidelines will help you to make wise use of the emergency medical services provided by the Wheeling Fire Department. An ambulance should be requested by calling 9-1-1 from either a landline or cellular telephone in cases of:

- chest pains or apparent stroke conditions
- difficulty breathing
- loss of consciousness
- fractures of long bones (ex. arms or legs) or skull
- trauma resulting in entrapment, amputations, or extensive blood loss, penetrating injuries of the central core (ex. abdomen, chest, neck, or head)
- fevers in excess of 101°F for extended periods of time
- second and third degree burns
- overdoses, ingestion or inhalation of toxic substances
- any other medical condition that appears to be immediately life threatening

An ambulance should NOT be requested when injuries or illnesses are not immediately life threatening, for example:

- scrapes, abrasions, and bruises
- black eyes
- splinters
- sore backs
- sore shoulders
- the flu or a bad cold that lasts several days
- any other minor medical condition in which the patient can safely and easily be treated by their personal physician, regional health clinic, or transported to the emergency room by private vehicle.
- broken fingers or toes
- minor punctures to the hands or feet
- indigestion
- sunburn
- minor rashes
- children with a cold

Of course, if you are ever in doubt as to whether or not to call an ambulance, don't wait, and immediately call 9-1-1. But by making wise use of the Village's emergency medical services, you are helping to make sure those services remain cost-effective and available for everyone when truly needed, to control your personal health care costs, and to reduce the potential for emergency room overload.

Improve Traffic Flow: Lining up at a Turn Arrow



How many times have you been waiting in your car to turn left, and when the light changes only two or three cars make it through before the light turns red again? Most intersections work off a "trip system," meaning that a series of wires in the pavement tells the light system how many cars are waiting and adjusts the light accordingly to allow the movement of those vehicles. The "trips" are a series of electrical circuits, each one activated by the previous one. Once a trip is not activated (no vehicle on the trip) the circuit is broken, and the light timing is set.

So how should you be a courteous driver in intersections that use a trip system?

- Pull all the way up to the wide white stop line if you are the first vehicle in line.
- Pull your vehicle up to the vehicle in front of you; DO NOT leave a large space between vehicles.
- Make sure that you are centered in your lane of traffic.

When you follow these steps, more vehicles will make it through the light and traffic will flow better.

And in our industrial sector, demand for sites continues to accelerate. For example, a U.S.-based multinational company has just stepped forward to lease a vacant 150,000-square-foot building. This new arrival is expected to bring over 100 employees to town. In November, the Village also co-hosted the Wheeling Manufacturing Conference and Career Expo at Wheeling High School for manufacturers and job seekers. Congressman Brad Schneider and Congresswoman Jan Schakowsky were the keynote speakers at the event. Dr. Lazaro Lopez, Associate Superintendent of School District 214, provided insight into the programs being offered at Wheeling High School and invited manufacturers to partner with the school on manufacturing programs and facilities, particularly their new Nanotechnology Lab.

Speaking of Wheeling High School, the Village Board and I recently had the privilege of proclaiming November 18, 2013 “Wheeling High School Boys’ Varsity Soccer Team Day” in recognition of their second-place finish at the state championships. This is a dedicated group of young men who worked hard to achieve the school’s best-ever record of 23-2-2, and also achieved program records for the most goals scored (90) and the fewest goals allowed (18). The achievements of the Boys’ Varsity Soccer Team are a testament not only to the skill and hard work of the team members, but also to the support they have received from their families, their fellow students, and Wheeling High School faculty, including Head Coach Ed Uhrick and Assistant Coaches Kevin Lennon, Robert Juszczuk, and Gilles Lonteen. The success of these young men is something in which all members of the Wheeling community can rightfully take pride, and I was proud to have been able to honor them.



I’m also proud to report that the Village recently received a letter from the Mayor of Gangnam, South Korea, accepting our invitation to pursue a Sister Cities relationship to provide exchanges of culture, education, investment, tourism, and trade. A primary objective of this initiative is creating opportunities for Wheeling manufacturers to export goods and services to South Korea. We also hope that this relationship will enable new educational exchanges for Wheeling students. In May of this year, the Gangnam Symphony Orchestra performed an amazing concert at Wheeling High School, and we hope to facilitate other such programs as this relationship continues to develop in the coming year.

I’d like to thank all of our residents and businesses on behalf of the entire Village Board for your support of our local economy, workforce, and schools, and for your significant charitable contributions and civic involvement. We recognize the tremendous value of the Wheeling taxpayers, and thank you for your contributions to our Village. And on a personal note, I’d like to take this opportunity to thank the Board of Trustees, Village Clerk, and Village Staff for continually working together towards the success and betterment of this great Village we call home.
