



## From the Desk of President Argiris

My fellow Wheeling residents, another frigid Illinois winter has arrived! But here's the good news: by the time this newsletter reaches you, the days will already be getting longer—and 2017 is already shaping up to be a great year for the Village of Wheeling.

The community's patience with the construction on Dundee Road will soon be rewarded by improvements to the Elmhurst Road, McHenry Road, and Community Boulevard intersections, all of which will help improve the flow of traffic and ease congestion on this critical east-west thoroughfare. The new traffic signal and roadway extension at Community Boulevard will provide safe and orderly public access to both the Post Office and the Community Campus, including the Wheeling Park District's Community Recreation Center, Aquatic Center, and Heritage Park, as well as our own Village Hall.

These improvements to Dundee Road are important to the future of Wheeling, particularly the long-awaited construction of Wheeling Town Center, the transit-oriented mixed-use development soon to be built between the Community Campus and the Metra Station. We recently passed a major milestone in that project, with the commencement of work to relocate a pipeline. In the spring, the developer will break ground on the residential building, the movie theater, and the retail outlets, as well as the Village Green, a gathering place with upscale landscaping, outdoor seating, fountains, and other appealing features. The entire project is scheduled to be completed in the autumn of 2018.

The 301 luxury apartments of Wheeling Town Center will join other high-end residential developments planned or underway along the Dundee corridor, including the recently-completed Northgate Crossing complex, where leasing activity continues to exceed projections. The Northgate Crossing developer is also in the process of constructing 14 townhomes on the east side of Northgate Parkway. Together with Wheeling Town Center, these projects will bring over 600 new households to the immediate vicinity of the Metra station: residents who'll live only a short stroll from new restaurants, new shops, and Heritage Park's world-class amenities, who'll be able to travel from their front doors to downtown Chicago in scarcely more than an hour, and to do so without ever getting behind the wheel of a car.

There's lots of exciting news elsewhere in town, as well. I and the Board of Trustees recently celebrated the opening of Siri, Wheeling's first-ever Indian restaurant, at 401 East Dundee Road in Riverside Plaza. In the Schwind Crossings center on Lake Cook Road, Café Zupas is in the process of moving into the former Fifth Third Bank building, and Binny's Beverage Depot will soon take occupancy of the former Staples site with the goal of opening in March. Meanwhile, on Restaurant Row, Boston Fish Market continues to make progress on the renovation of the former Pete Miller's restaurant.

In another sign of prosperity for Wheeling's industrial community, we're seeing rapid progress on the first speculative industrial facility to be built here in decades. The planned 181,000-square-foot building, which will be located across Northgate Parkway from Wieland Metals, will accommodate multiple industrial tenants that will bring an estimated 180 jobs to town. Construction of the \$10 million project is expected to start in April.

On a final note, I'd like to briefly mention the new holiday displays that you've seen in Friendship Park and elsewhere. The Village updated its lighting and decorations not only to brighten the dark winter days with beautiful and dynamic new decorations, but also to introduce state-of-the-art LED technology that's more energy-efficient and durable, thereby saving money in the long run. In this sense, the holiday lights are emblematic of everything the Village does: a reminder that we are always hard at work on your behalf, in ways that are both obvious and invisible.

### Winter Weather Reminder

With winter officially upon us, I would like to remind everyone to check on your neighbors during this time of year. In my neighborhood the residents make a point to check up on each other regularly, and I am very grateful for this. One sign that a neighbor may be having an issue is if newspapers are piling up in their driveway or the garbage is not set out on the correct day. Take an extra few minutes to check in with your neighbors and do what you can to help out during these cold winter months.

### Upcoming Events for Wheeling Residents

On Wednesday, February 22 at 6 p.m. the Wheeling Historical Society will have their annual White Elephant Auction at Chamber Park, 127 N. Wolf Road. Residents can bring in their treasures to be auctioned off and a fun time will be had by all.

In March, the Wheeling Garden Club will resume meetings on the second Wednesday of the month at the Wheeling Senior Center, 199 N. First Street.

On the first Wednesday of each month at 7 p.m., the Police Department holds their Police Crime Watch Meetings at the Police Station, 1 Community Boulevard. Crime Watch Meetings are an opportunity for residents and business owners to meet with Wheeling Police Officers in an effort to solve problems collectively. Area crime statistics are reported, citizen concerns are addressed, and methods to resolve these issues are discussed. Meetings end with an informational training topic presented. All members of the community are invited to participate in these open meetings.



### Community Blood Drives

The 2017 Wheeling Community Blood Drives will be held March 8, July 12, and November 8 from 2–7 p.m. at Village Hall. Please donate; each pint of blood saves three lives! During blood drives in 2016, 110 units of blood were collected. Thank you to all the residents who donated. ### Medication/Sharps Collection

Wheeling provides a medication and sharps collection for all residents. The Medication and Sharps Collection is held on the third Saturday of every month from 10 a.m.– 2 p.m. in front of the Police Station located at 1 Community Blvd. We accept:

- Prescription and over-the-counter medications in their original containers. No over-the-counter liquid medications will be accepted. We cannot accept any controlled substances. Visit [www.swancc.org](http://www.swancc.org) for a list of all controlled substances.
  - Keep pharmaceuticals in their original containers with labels to identify contents.
  - Use a permanent marker to cross out your name and other personal information.
- Sharps (needles and syringes) in rigid containers with a sealed lid. Sharps containers will be handed out at the collection and are available at the Community Development Department at Village Hall.

We also accept the following:

- Household and rechargeable batteries. No automotive batteries will be accepted. Each rechargeable battery must have masking tape on contact points or be contained in an individual self-locking plastic bag.
- Glasses, including eyeglasses, sunglasses, telescopic, magnifying, and prescription. Children's glasses are especially needed and will be given to a program called "Recycle for Sight" which refurbishes eyeglasses for those in need.

### Safe Babies, Safe Place, Safe Haven

Please remember that in Illinois, a parent who cannot care for their newborn baby, up to 30 days old, can legally give the unharmed infant to a staff member at a staffed fire station, police station, hospital, or emergency care facility and walk away, no questions asked. No one will ask your name. Your baby will get medical care and be placed for adoption into a loving family. You can even provide anonymous medical information, so your baby will grow up with a medical history. A packet of information is given to the parent, and the baby is transported to a hospital for a check-up. The baby is then placed with a pre-approved adoption agency. If you or anyone you know is pregnant and does not feel like they have any options, please call either a crisis counselor at the Save Abandoned Babies Foundation at 888.510.BABY (2229) or a Social Worker with the Social Services Division at 847.459.2606. Assistance is available, and choices and resources will be given.

## Plan Now for Spring Storms

Right now in the middle of winter it is hard to think about spring storms, but it is never too early to start planning. As the snow melts and is combined with heavy spring rains, this can bring localized, as well as regional flooding. And while tornados can occur in any month of the year, the peak time for them in our area is March through June. So now is the time to plan for these changes in weather to protect yourself, your family, and your home.



- **Throughout the winter, when you shovel your driveway, also shovel the snow from on top of the storm sewer grate.** During the winter, snow piles can accumulate on top of storm sewer grates in the street. As the snow melts and the rains begin, there is nowhere for the water to drain into the storm sewers. Depending on the grading around your home, the water can back up into your yard, and in worst-case scenarios leak into your home, particularly if you have a basement. Clearing snow from storm sewer grates near your home now will allow water to drain away properly.

- **If unsure of your sump pump's age, or if it's been a long time since it was replaced, replace it.** Many homes in Wheeling have sump pumps, particularly those that have basements. A sump pump takes water that collects around the foundation of your home and pumps it farther away to properly drain. Water that collects around your home's foundation can place pressure on the foundation, particularly during spring thaws and heavy spring rains. This pressure can cause cracks and leaks into basements, as well as uneven settling of your home that results in interior cracks, etc. Most people take their sump pump for granted and only react when it fails. Unfortunately by the time you find out that the sump pump has stopped working, the damage is already done to your home. If your sump pump runs often, it will typically only last five to seven years. If it doesn't run often, it will typically last approximately ten years. A discharge extension hose or pipe from your sump pump can get the discharged water more than three feet away from your home. Remember to be a good neighbor and don't discharge your sump pump onto your neighbor's property. Lastly, connecting sump pumps to sanitary sewer drains is dangerous and illegal in the Village of Wheeling.

- **Plan now on how you can divert some rainwater away from your home's foundation.** This will also reduce the wear and tear on your sump pump. This can be done by placing extensions on your home's downspouts as soon as the weather starts to warm up. Like using a sump pump discharge extension hose, extending your downspouts two to three feet will aid in preventing water from backing up around your foundation and eventually into your home.

- **Show your family or someone special that you love them very much on Valentine's Day by purchasing them a weather alert radio.** Weather alert radios are activated by a special radio transmission from the National Weather Service whenever there is a risk of hazardous weather in our area. Unlike your personal radio or television, a weather radio is active 24/7, even in the middle of the night. Studies have shown that early warning during a tornado is critical to increasing your chances of survival. - **Make sure you have a family disaster plan and a family disaster kit.** During a natural disaster, you should plan on being self-sufficient for up to three days. Roads may be unpassable, the electrical power may be out, cellular service will be interrupted (i.e. no internet), and the Village water system may be unavailable. You need to be able to survive on your own without any assistance from the Village, State, or Federal governments during this three-day period. By planning now and developing a family disaster kit, you can do it without the stress of an ongoing actual disaster and obtain your supplies while they are in abundance. ## Waste Management Holiday

Waste Management will be observing Monday, January 2, 2017, as a holiday. Refuse and recycling will be delayed by one day during this week.

## Reminders to Landlords and Rental Property Owners

With the arrival of cold weather, our municipal inspectors would like to remind all landlords and residential property owners that per Village Code 15.16.001 (d), heat must be supplied to your building from September 15–May 15 and kept at a temperature no lower than 68 degrees. If you have questions regarding this ordinance, please contact the Community Development Department at 847.459.2620.

## Protect Water Lines from Freezing



Follow these measures to protect water lines from freezing and prevent water pipes from rupturing during extreme cold:

- Monitor water meters: Wrap water meters with foam insulation or heat tape if located in unheated or colder areas such as crawlspaces. Periodically check your meter and associated piping for cracks or leaks and ensure proper marking and operation of the shut-off valve in case a pipe bursts.

- Eliminate drafts: All crawlspace and basement vents, windows, and doors should be repaired and closed, making sure a tight seal exists to keep out cold air.
- Insulate pipes: Insulating pipes in colder or unheated areas such as the crawlspace, or pipes located adjacent to an outside wall, helps to reduce the possibility of ruptured pipes. Allow warm air to circulate around pipes accessible by cabinets and located against outside walls.
- Leave faucets running: Keeping a continuous trickle of cold water running can help reduce the possibility of a pipe bursting due to freezing.

If you know that a property has been unoccupied for several days, contact the Public Works Utility Division at 847.279.6900 so they can verify if water services are shut off at the property. This can prevent costly damage to the unoccupied property.

## Electronic Waste Recycling

With new electronics received during the holiday season replacing used or outdated ones, it is important to dispose of electronics properly. In Illinois, electronic waste is not permitted in landfills due to concerns that toxic materials within certain electronics infiltrate and pollute groundwater supplies.

For appropriate recycling of electronic waste at no cost, Wheeling residents with identification can transport electronics to a year-round drop-off location owned and operated by the Solid Waste Agency of Northern Cook County (SWANCC); see address below. A list of acceptable items at this drop-off location is available at <http://www.swancc.org/recycling/electronics-recycling>. Alternatively, some electronic retail stores may accept the drop-off of items for a fee.



Non-artificial holiday trees are collected at residential curbsides by Waste Management during the first two weeks in January at no additional charge. Trees that have decorations or are in stands or plastic bags will not be collected.

Residents may recycle holiday lights including mini, C7, C9, rope, and LED lights as well as extension cords of all colors and lengths at the Department of Public Works, 77 W. Hintz Road, November 1, 2016 to February 28, 2017, Monday through Friday from 7 a.m. to 3 p.m. Garland, live greens, wreaths, and other non-recyclables are not accepted in this recycling program. ## Snow Season Procedures

Public Works personnel are preparing for snow control with salt deliveries, vehicle preparation, and year-round training. Snow and ice responsibilities include de-icing and clearing arterial, collector, and residential roadways, certain sections of public sidewalks, bus stops, the train station, and Village-owned buildings and properties.


Public Works is not responsible for the maintenance or snow control on County- or State-owned roadways or rights-of-way. These roadways include:

### Driveway Snow Shoveling Recommendations

When shoveling snow at the end of a driveway, place the snow to the right of the driveway (as you face the street) to avoid the snow being pushed back onto the driveway by a snowplow truck. Also, clear a few feet at the edge of the street and curb to the left of the driveway (as you face the street). This will help reduce the amount of snow at the end of the driveway. Refer to the illustration above.

### Residents are advised of the following safety tips during the snow season:

- Stay 100 feet or more behind a snowplow or salt truck.
- Shovel snow away from fire hydrants near your property for emergency access.
- Do not place refuse, refuse containers, or any other items in the street.

### Vehicle Parking Restrictions

Do not park on any Village street within eight hours after a snowfall of two inches or more to allow safe and efficient snow and ice control by Public Works. Vehicles in violation of this restriction may be towed.

### Sidewalk Requirements

- Per Village Code, Residents and property owners are responsible for clearing snow and ice from sidewalks adjoining or adjacent to their property by 10 a.m. the day after a snowfall. Property owners are permitted to spread sand, salt, or other substances made for the purpose of melting snow and ice on sidewalks.
- Residents and property owners shall not deposit snow or ice onto any roadway within the Village; instead, deposit snow and ice onto the parkway.

## Text to 9-1-1 Now Available in Wheeling

Starting January 2, 2017, Wheeling residents will have the option of texting 9-1-1 to request emergency assistance, a valuable service that makes it easier to contact 9-1-1 for people who are deaf or hard of hearing, who have a speech disability, or who are in a situation in which making a call could be dangerous. Verizon, Sprint, AT&T, and T-Mobile customers will be able to text their exact location and the nature of their emergency to 9-1-1, and a telecommunicator will respond.



Texting 9-1-1 is a valuable option, but it does have its limitations. Making a phone call is still the best option when possible, because it allows the caller to relay information more quickly. When you make a voice call to 9-1-1, the telecommunicator will typically instantly receive your phone number and your approximate location. In most cases, however, text messages do not automatically provide this type of information to telecommunicators. As is the case with all text messages, text messages to 9-1-1 can take longer to get through, they may be delivered out of order, and in some cases they may not be received at all.

Text-to-9-1-1 is not available when you are in a “roaming” situation. A text or data plan is required to place a text to 9-1-1; third-party texting applications are not compatible. Photos and videos cannot be sent to 9-1-1 at this time. Text-to-9-1-1 cannot include more than one person; do not copy your emergency text to anyone other than 9-1-1. Do not text and drive!

### How do I text to 9-1-1?

- 1) Enter the numbers 911 in the “To” or “Recipient” field;
- 2) Text in English using no abbreviations or slang.
- 3) Text your exact location including your town and ask for police, fire, or ambulance.
- 4) Push the “Send” button.
- 5) Answer questions and follow instructions from the 9-1-1 call taker.

Texting is not available everywhere. Anyone who texts 9-1-1 in an area where call centers do not yet support texts will receive a bounce-back message informing them that the text has not been sent and that they should try to call 9-1-1 instead.
