

From the Desk of President Horcher

On behalf of the Board of Trustees, I'd like to share news about a couple of significant recent developments that you'll be hearing more about in the months to come.

As many of our residents have probably noticed, the Wheeling Park District has begun the \$18.8 million renovation and expansion of the Community Recreation Center at Heritage Park, Wheeling's preeminent indoor recreational facility.

This construction project will also create permanent homes for senior recreation services and for the Village's popular congregate dining program in state-of-the-art facilities. Last month the Village and the Park District signed a redevelopment agreement under which the Village will contribute \$1.8 million in tax increment financing (TIF) funds toward the renovation project in order to help maintain senior programming at the location best suited for it. The Park District has hosted most senior programming since the Wheeling Pavilion Senior Center closed in December, and once the congregate dining program has relocated to the CRC the transfer of services will be complete.

The Park District has undertaken this critical renovation project proactively to stay ahead of the community's needs. Thanks in large part to the Village's encouragement of transit-oriented mixed-use development in the vicinity of the Wheeling Metra station, hundreds of new Wheeling residents now live or will soon be living only steps away from Heritage Park, at Northgate Crossing, Wheeling Town Center, and other pending developments. The Village is honored to continue the effective partnership with the Park District that began with the creation of the Community Campus, and we look forward to continued cooperation in service to our residents.

On the topic of mixed-use transit-oriented development, the Village has also signed a redevelopment agreement regarding Uptown 500, a \$90 million project to be constructed at the northwest corner of Dundee Road and Northgate Parkway, across from Wheeling Town Center; the project will include 321 apartment units, 10,500 square feet of retail space, and a 444-unit parking structure. This agreement is the result of extensive discussions with the developer to produce a project that will be a good fit for the site and will help complete the transformation of Wheeling's main commuter corridor. The Village is pleased to see Uptown 500 take this significant step forward.

We'll continue to provide updates on these and other notable developments. Until then, the Board and I wish you a safe and enjoyable summer! We hope to see you at Rock 'n' Run the Runway on Saturday, June 30, or at one of the season's other upcoming community events.



Summer Storms and Power Outages

Summer thunderstorms occasionally bring power outages due to downed power lines. When this occurs, it is important for all residents to exercise extreme caution and follow these basic safety tips:

• **Do not call 9-1-1 unless there is an actual emergency.** Examples of actual emergencies when you should call 9-1-1 include electrocution, structure fires, live (i.e. arcing) power lines lying on top of an individual, live power lines lying on top of a vehicle with individuals inside, or live power lines lying on top of a structure.

• **Call 1-800-EDISON1 (1-800-334-7661) to report downed power lines and/or loss of electrical power.**

• **Do not call the Village, elected officials, or the Fire, Police, or Public Works departments to inquire about electrical power restoration.** The Village of Wheeling, its elected officials, and its operating departments have no control or authority over how or when your electrical power is restored. During major storms, electrical power outages may be widespread and in some cases ComEd may take several days to complete restoration in our area. Regardless of where you purchase your electrical power from, all damage to the electrical distribution system is handled by ComEd in our area. • **If power lines are lying in your yard, stay a minimum of 25 feet away, preferably more if possible.** Do not touch metal fences or siding, since they can become energized by downed power lines. Notify ComEd and then monitor the situation. Keep children, pets, and neighbors a safe distance away. Never assume that a downed power line is de-energized; newer technology can re-energize downed power lines during the restoration process and without warning. Always assume that a downed power line is energized and capable of killing you.

• **Have a personal emergency plan that allows you to be self-sufficient for a minimum of three days.** Be aware that the Village of Wheeling does not routinely open "cooling centers" during power outages. Emergency plans should include non-perishable food, a non-electric can opener, potable water, a battery-operated radio, several flashlights with spare batteries, and a supply of essential prescription medications. If you have pets, do not forget to include food and water for them in your disaster plan. For more information on developing a personal emergency disaster plan, please go to ready.gov/make-a-plan

• **If using a backup electrical generator during a power outage, only operate it outside in a well-ventilated area to avoid the buildup of carbon monoxide (CO).** Do not operate an electrical generator inside your home or garage. Only refill the fuel tank when the generator is completely shut off and the motor is completely cooled down. Appliance and Electronic Material Disposal

Appliances such as refrigerators, freezers, ovens, washers, air conditioners, humidifiers, dryers, water heaters, water softeners, dishwashers, stoves, ranges, furnaces, etc. require a special collection and separate disposal per state law. Residents must contact Waste Management at 1.800.796.9696 to schedule a collection; a charge will apply for each item.

Electronics such as computers, televisions, printers, scanners, DVD players or recorders, video game consoles, cable receivers, VCRs, digital music players, etc. will not be collected by Waste Management. Wheeling residents can bring electronic items to the Solid Waste Agency of Northern Cook County (SWANCC) one-day events or drop-off locations. Locations and a list of acceptable electronic items can be found at swancc.org or by contacting SWANCC at 847.724.9205. Items from businesses, schools, or institutions will not be accepted.

Caring for Newly-Planted Parkway Trees

If your address has received a new parkway tree, the Village is requesting your assistance in promoting its health and growth.

Watering is the key to a new tree's survival; too much water will drown a tree and too little will dry it. During a normal season, a tree should receive one inch of water per week. Watering should only be performed May through September, and only if sufficient rainfall does not occur. It is important to keep the new tree watered for the first year after planting.

A Treegator bag, which is a slow-release watering bag, has been wrapped around the parkway tree to assist in the watering process. These bags hold approximately 15 gallons of water and release the water through small holes that slowly drain the bag within five to nine hours. We ask that you please fill the Treegator bag with water once a week throughout the summer. Public Works will remove the bag from the tree during the month of September.

Summer Property Maintenance

Community Development property maintenance staff will be out in force this summer ensuring that properties in our community are observing the following property maintenance requirements:

- Maintain grass and weeds (maximum height eight inches).
- Maintain shrubs and trees, including removal or pruning of dead, overgrown, or improperly maintained plants.
- Keep building exterior free of cracking and peeling paint.
- Keep fences, sheds, and accessory structures in good repair.
- Stow garbage cans in the garage or adjacent to the house in a side or rear yard between pick-up days.

If you notice ill-kept properties in your neighborhood, please contact Community Development at 847.459.2620 or our anonymous Code hotline at 847.459.CODE (2633) so our staff can investigate the status of the properties and take 8 steps to re-establish maintenance.

Do You Need a Permit?

Before you build or remodel structures within the Village, it is likely you will need a permit. The Building Division ensures projects comply with current life-safety building codes. Permit forms are available on the Village's website. If you are unsure if you are required to have a permit for work on your property, please inquire through Community Development at 847.459.2620.

Yard Waste Collection Reminder

Yard waste collection for single-family residences occurs on regularly scheduled garbage days. The program continues until November 30. Townhome units and condominiums are not provided with yard waste services.

Residents are reminded to please follow the guidelines below to ensure collection:

- Yard waste must be placed in biodegradable two-ply paper bags or in a container clearly marked with a red "X" around the body of the container.
- Bags and/or containers must not be larger than 32 gallons in size and must not exceed 50 lbs. in weight. There is no limit to the number of bags or containers.
- Yard waste in bags and/or containers exceeding the weight restriction will not be collected.
- Yard waste in plastic bags or cardboard boxes will not be collected.
- All yard waste must be placed at the curb for collection by 6 a.m. the day of scheduled collection but not before 5 p.m. the evening before scheduled collections.
- Brush and tree trimmings must be bundled and tied with biodegradable twine or string in distinct piles that are no more than four feet in length and two feet in diameter and weigh no more than 50 lbs., with no individual branch greater than three inches in diameter. There is no limit to the amount of bundled brush.

Summer Bike Rodeos






