

From the Desk of President Horcher

It's hard to believe, but just one year ago in this newsletter we announced that ground had officially broken on the long-awaited Wheeling Town Center project. If you've passed the site recently, you know that much progress has been made since that time. As of this writing, the Wheeling Town Center's residential building has been completely enclosed and interior work is moving at a steady pace. The retail portion of the project is already over 80 percent leased. Thus far, the Wheeling Town Center development team has secured CMX Theaters, City Works Eatery and Pour House, Mia's Cantina, Meat and Potatoes, Inland Bank, The Learning Experience, and Starbucks. The shell of the City Works Eatery is up with masonry walls, steel structure, and roof assembly in place. Foundations are already completed for several of the other tenants. If you haven't driven past this development at the corner of Northgate Parkway and Dundee Road,

you should swing by!

Once complete, the Wheeling Town Center will create a walkable downtown with luxury apartments, restaurants, retail, and services adjacent to the Metra train station. This transit-oriented community has been a main focus of the Village Board, and directly aligns with the Village's Strategic Plan. There will be nearly 1,000 new apartments within walking distance of the train station. The project is expected to be completed in early 2019. In addition, the Uptown 500 project, which will be developed across the street from the Wheeling Town Center, is expected to host a groundbreaking ceremony this fall.

And it isn't just the Town Center that we have to be proud of. Wheeling is well-known for its manufacturing stronghold in the region, being the fifth largest manufacturing hub in the state of Illinois in terms of employment. Two new industrial buildings totaling over 265,000 square feet were recently completed, and Wieland Metals has proposed a new 110,000-square-foot building along Northgate Parkway. With a four percent vacancy rate, Wheeling's industrial sector benefits our residents with strong industrial employment opportunities and a healthy business climate.

Recently it was my privilege to recognize Wheeling resident Tracy Sefcik for her admirable efforts to raise funds and awareness for military veterans. A veteran of the United State Navy, Ms. Sefcik set out on a bicycle journey from California to Florida, raising funds for the Gary Sinise Foundation, an organization that provides support and appreciation for active-duty military personnel, military veterans, and first responders, as well as their families. Designating her journey Cross Country Cycle 4 Vets, Ms. Sefcik was able to raise over \$25,000. This is a great accomplishment, and I hope you'll join me in congratulating our fellow Wheeling resident on this feat.

On Saturday, September 29 we'll once again be hosting an all-you-can-eat pancake Community Breakfast! The cost of this breakfast is merely a canned good or other non-perishable item. All donations will be provided to local food pantries as they prepare for their busiest months of the year. The breakfast will run from 8-10:30 a.m at Fire Station #42, 1 Community Boulevard. Come on out to visit with your Board and support a worthy cause!

November 6 Election – Register to Vote, Early Voting, Vote by Mail

Voter Registration

If you are not yet registered, you can do so at the Village Hall Monday–Friday from 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. You may also register online at ova.elections.il.gov. **The last days to register to vote for the Gubernatorial Election are October 9 for in-person registration and October 21 for online registration. Mailed paper applications must be postmarked by October 9.** If you miss these deadlines, grace period registration is available at early voting locations until November 5; after registering you must immediately cast your ballot. Election Day registration is available at your home precinct only.



Early and Mail Voting

Early voting for the November 6 Gubernatorial Election runs October 22–November 5. In Wheeling you can place your early voting ballot at the George and Angela Paterakis Center, 199 N. First Street (the former Senior Center). Additional locations can be found online at cookcountyclerk.com. You can request a mail ballot from now until November 1; applications are available at the Cook County Clerk's website and at Village Hall. Mail ballots must be postmarked by November 6.

Election Day

On Tuesday, November 6 polls are open from 6 a.m.–7 p.m. If you are unsure of your precinct and polling location, please contact Deputy Clerk Karen Henneberry at 847.499.9085 or visit cookcountyclerk.com, where you can also verify your registration and view a sample ballot. All voters are encouraged to verify their registration before arriving at the polls.

Medicare Open Enrollment

October 15 - December 7

Medicare health and drug plans can make changes each year to things like cost, coverage, and what providers and pharmacies are in their networks. October 15 to December 7 is the time when all people with Medicare can change their health plans and prescription drug coverage for the following year to better meet their needs. Information for next year's plans will be available beginning in October.

If you are in a Medicare health or prescription drug plan, always review the materials your plans send you, like the "Evidence of Coverage" (EOC) and "Annual Notice of Change" (ANOC). If plans are changing, make sure your plan will still meet your needs for the following year. If you're satisfied with your current plan and it's still being offered, you don't need to do anything.

To find Medicare plan information or compare plans, call 1-800-MEDICARE or visit medicare.gov. Call the Village of Wheeling Human Services Department Senior Services Division at 847.459.2670 for an appointment to find the best prescription drug plan for your individual needs for 2019. Appointments are available during open enrollment on Wednesdays and Thursdays from 9 a.m.– 3 p.m.

Join us on October 11 at 7 p.m. for an informational presentation on Medicare to learn everything you need to know to make educated decisions about your health care. Trained Human Services staff will walk participants through the steps to register for Medicare and also discuss what you need to know if you already have Medicare. Wheeling Police Department Survey Results

In February of 2018, surveys regarding resident satisfaction with the Wheeling Police Department were mailed out to 1,500 randomly selected Wheeling residents and business owners. Results indicate that residents are satisfied with police protection and services within the Village of Wheeling. Thank you to those who participated! Here's a summary of what people had to say:

- 36% have lived or worked in Wheeling for 20+ years, while only 6% have lived in Wheeling for less than a year.
- 44% live in a condo/townhome, while 38% indicated they live in a single family home.
- The respondents were pretty evenly distributed between men and women at 48% male, 52% female.
- Almost half indicated they are at least 60 years old.
- 32% have had contact with police in the last year.
- 4% have been the victims of crime within the last year, while 15% had "other" contact with police.
- 89% feel safe in their homes or businesses.
- 89% feel safe walking in their neighborhood.
- 73% believe the police presence in their neighborhood is appropriate.
- 67% believe the Wheeling Police respond to calls in a timely manner.
- 74% believe that traffic enforcement in the village meets the needs of the community.
- 75% believe that officers and employees of the WPD are knowledgeable and competent in the performance of their duties.
- 68% believe the WPD provides appropriate community education and outreach programs.*
- 82% said that officers and employees are professional and respectful.
- 85% said that the overall performance of the WPD meets their expectations.

Guidelines for Leaf Disposal

Village Code 11.08.100 prohibits the deposit of leaves into streets, roads, or highways, and along the shoulder, curb, or edge of any street, road, or highway.

- Leaves intentionally raked into such areas can result in clogged storm sewer drains and subsequent flooding.
- The Village's contract with Waste Management provides an alternate, convenient method to dispose of leaves and other forms of yard waste for single-family residents.
- In addition to two-ply Kraft biodegradable paper yard waste bags, residents may use rigid 32-gallon containers clearly marked with a red "X" around the container.
- Containers and biodegradable bags, when filled, may not exceed 45 pounds in weight. There is no limit to the number of yard waste bags or containers allowed.
- Yard waste in plastic bags or cardboard boxes will not be collected.
- Brush must be bundled and tied with biodegradable twine or string. Bundles must not weigh over 45 lbs., exceed four feet in length or two feet in diameter, or contain limbs greater than three inches in diameter. There is no limit to the number of brush bundles allowed.
- Loose or larger brush or logs will not be collected by Waste Management.
- Yard waste collections conclude on November 30, 2018.

Storm Drain Grate/Inlet Cleaning

Storm drain grates/inlets help collect water and are normally located near the edges of streets or in yards. Grates/inlets blocked by leaves and other debris (i.e. grass clippings, tree seeds, branches, etc.) do not allow for a continual water flow and may cause localized flooding. The Village encourages residents to check storm sewer grates/inlets near their property before, during, and after rain events unless a thunderstorm is occurring or there is concern for lightning. Do not stuff the debris into the grate/inlet or blow the debris into the street. If there is a larger concern, residents may contact the Public Works Department at 847.279.6900.

The Village encourages residents to help remove debris from storm sewer inlets.



Update Your Contact Information with WM

Waste Management (WM) notifies residents anytime there is a service-related issue such as delayed pick-ups due to holidays or extreme weather. Residents are encouraged to update their account information (telephone numbers and/or email address) to receive communications from WM. Please contact WM at 1.800.796.9696.

Household Hazardous / Chemical Waste

Household products such as cleaners, lawn or garden care products, antifreeze, pesticides, etc., can contain hazardous ingredients that can be harmful to human health and the environment, and that require proper and safe disposal. It is highly recommended that you purchase limited quantities of household hazardous products so that the amount of hazardous waste produced is limited.

Long-term (permanent) household hazardous waste disposal drop-off facilities are available to Illinois residents at no charge. These permanent facilities are located in Naperville, Rockford, Chicago, and Gurnee (by appointment only). For information on these locations and items that are accepted, please visit:

Latex Paint:

Water-based latex paint is not hazardous due to water replacing most of the oil-based components. Therefore, it is not accepted at any Illinois drop-off facilities. The following method is required for proper disposal of latex paints:

- Open paint cans in well-ventilated areas and add an absorbent such as kitty litter, sand, oil-dry, or shredded paper into the cans.
- When the liquid paint is absorbed and the paint is hardened, place lids back on the paint cans and dispose of cans in regular refuse containers (not recycling!).
- If paint cans are full, divide the paint into empty cans to solidify or repeat the absorption process.

Recycling At Risk – Know the Do's and Don'ts of Recycling

Waste Management collects hundreds of tons of recycling material every day in communities. Unfortunately, a higher percentage of non-recyclable materials are being found in recycling, thus contaminating other recycling materials and potentially causing the entire recycling load to become garbage. The recycling industry is requiring appropriate, clean, quality materials with virtually no contamination.

Some of the most common contaminants that are found in the recycling stream, which should not be included in curbside recycling, include:

- Plastic bags. Many local grocery and retail stores have a drop-off for plastic bags.
- Pizza boxes and food containers which contain residual grease, cheese, or other toppings. Do not include food, food-soiled containers, or liquids in recycling.
- Bubble wrap and plastic/shrink wrap.
- Electrical cords, string/rope material, rubber and plastic hose.
- Clothing and clothing hangers of any type.
- Styrofoam and packing material.
- Propane tanks, construction debris, batteries, and electronic waste.
- Medical equipment and devices of any kind, such as needles/syringes, tubing, and gloves. For information on the Village's Sharps Disposal Program, please contact Community Development at 847.459.2620.
- Ceramics, bakeware, mirrors, ornamental glass, and auto glass.

When recycling bottles and containers, please empty and rinse. Caps and lids on plastic containers may be left on, but caps and lids on glass bottles and jars need to be removed.

Battery Recycling

The Village's Battery Recycling Program, which included a drop-off at Public Works, has been suspended. While alkaline batteries are considered non-hazardous and can be disposed of in regular garbage, it is important to understand that older batteries may not be completely drained of power and may create a spark if grouped together, allowing the terminal/contact points to touch. To avoid this risk, place tape over the terminal/contact points before disposal, or drop off used batteries at retail stores that accept them.

Rechargeable batteries, including nickel cadmium (NiCd), nickel metal hydride (NiMH), and others may contain mercury and other heavy metals and should be recycled. Many retail stores accept older, rechargeable batteries for disposal. Again, place tape over each terminal/contact point to prevent sparking.






