From the Desk of President Horcher

This June the Village of Wheeling is celebrating a special milestone—the 125th anniversary of our incorporation as a Village! To honor the occasion, we have a few special events planned, including a parade along Dundee Road on June 23 and our annual Rock 'n' Run the Runway Independence Day event—this year with a special focus on Wheeling musical artists including our own American Idol, Haley Reinhart—held at Chicago Executive Airport on June 29. See page 11 of this newsletter for more details on these two events. Additional commemorative celebrations will be taking place throughout the anniversary year, so be sure to keep an eye out for those announcements.

As we reflect on 125 years of Wheeling's growth, it's great to be witnessing the long-awaited goal of our Town Center coming to fruition. By now you've probably noticed that Starbucks is the Town Center's first open and operating business. This is a great milestone for our long-awaited development, and I look forward to the opening of the remaining businesses and the completion of Wheeling Town Center. Along with the already completed Northgate Crossing townhomes, the currently under construction Uptown 500 townhomes and retail space, and the new Wheeling Park District Community Recreation Center, this development will complete a true transformation of our downtown area, and I hope you all are as excited as I am to witness it all come together.

On April 2 we had an election for three Village Trustee positions. Many congratulations to incumbent Trustees Ray Lang, Joe Vito, and Dave Vogel on their re-elections! Each campaigned hard to continue representing the residents of Wheeling, and I look forward to continuing to work together. Thank you as well to all of the candidates for their enthusiasm and commitment to civic engagement. We will also be welcoming a new face to the Wheeling Village Board: Jim Ruffatto. You may recognize Jim from his 15 years of service on the Wheeling Plan Commission. The Board and I have chosen to appoint him to the seat that became vacant as a result of the passing of Ken Brady. We believe he will be a great fit on the Board and will bring an already vast knowledge of Wheeling and our vision to the table.

In the April election voters were also able to voice their opinion on a referendum question that was put forth as a result of a group of concerned citizens gathering petitions. Residents were asked if they would support runway expansion at Chicago Executive Airport outside of the existing roadway boundaries. An overwhelming majority of you stated that you do not support runway expansion, which is in line with the Village Board's current stance as well. While our Board supports the airport's Master Planning process currently underway, we strongly advocate the optimization of the airport's operations within its existing boundaries, and will not support expansion that would negatively impact our community and neighbors. We're glad to know we're on the same page with our residents on this important matter.

Finally, I'd like to pay tribute to Village Trustee Ken Brady, who passed away in February. Ken served the Village as a Trustee for nearly 14 years, and as a Plan Commissioner for 17 years prior to that. His care and commitment to the Village of Wheeling will be sorely missed. With former Village President Judy Abruscato—who served on the Village Board for 26 years—and longtime Plan Commissioner Pam Dorband, Ken was one of three distinguished public servants that Wheeling has lost during the past year, and their contributions to the community leave very big shoes for the rest of us to fill. All three are inspiring examples as we consider ways to work together for the benefit of Wheeling in this 125th anniversary year.

Drive Like You Work Here

Penalties

Safety Tips

- Drop it and drive.
- Slow down and obey speed limits.
- If possible, move over for workers.
- Pay attention; conditions can change quickly.
- Give heavy vehicles room to adjust to conditions.
- Remember: Traffic backups can occur at any time.



Warm Weather Storm Safety

Each year, deadly tornados show how unpredictable severe weather can be. Knowing what to do can minimize the potential for serious injury to you and your family, as well as potential damage to your home or business. Prepare yourself by getting to know what to do when these terms are used by the National Weather Service.

•SEVERE THUNDERSTORM WATCH:

Conditions are right for thunderstorms that could be severe and produce large amounts of localized rain, hail, and high winds. Monitor the radio, television, and/or internet for further weather updates. Walk around the outside of your home and secure any loose items. Avoid leaving your home or business unless absolutely necessary.

•SEVERE THUNDERSTORM WARNING:


A thunderstorm has developed and is producing large amounts of localized rain, hail, and/or high winds. Immediately go inside a building and close all blinds on the side of the building from which the storm is approaching. Do not stand in front of or near windows, talk on a hardwired telephone, or use plumbing fixtures until the storm passes.

•TORNADO WATCH:

Conditions are right for development of tornados. Take the same precautions listed above for "Severe Thunderstorm Watch" to prepare.

•TORNADO WARNING:

A tornado has been reported or been observed by radar. This is the only event in which Wheeling's warning sirens will be activated. Immediately take protective cover in your basement or an interior room. Sit with your back against the wall with your head between your knees and your fingers interlaced behind your head. If you are caught outside, find the lowest depression in the ground and lay flat on your stomach with your fingers interlaced behind your head and your eyes closed. If you are in your car, attempt to get inside a nearby structure. If this is not possible, pull your car over to the side of the road, turn on your emergency flashers, and get down on the floor of the vehicle.

How to Avoid Recycling Contamination

Recycling contamination occurs when non-recyclable materials are mixed in with recyclable materials, causing problems when these materials are sorted, and reducing the amount of material that can ultimately be recycled. Over the last few years recycling contamination has steadily increased, affecting both processing facilities and the economic market for recyclable materials. Recycling facility machinery and sorting lines slow down because of the introduction of non-recyclable material, and employee safety can be in jeopardy, especially when sharps or chemicals are placed in recycling carts/containers. Not everything is recyclable through the single-stream recycling cart or container, and an entire load can be rejected for processing.

To avoid recycling contamination, review the list below that includes **acceptable** materials in the Village's recycling program. All containers should be washed out and emptied.

- Aluminum cans
- Plastic containers with symbols #3 – #7
- Steel and tin cans
- Magazine, glossy inserts, and pamphlets
- Newspaper
- Uncoated printing, writing, or office paper
- Corrugated containers and cardboard, uncoated
- Cartons
- PET bottles with the symbol #1, with screw tops only
- HDPE plastic bottles with symbol #2 (milk, water, detergent, shampoo, etc.)
- Phone books
- Aseptic containers (i.e. drink boxes)
- Mail (flyers, catalogs, coupons)
- Paperboard, uncoated (cereal boxes, food, or snack boxes)
- Glass food and beverage containers, brown, clear, or green

Not acceptable and non-recyclable materials:

- Mirrors
- Household appliances and electronics
- Plastics NOT numbered
- Expanded polystyrene
- Glass & metal cookware & bakeware
- Flexible plastic, film packaging, or laminated materials
- Food waste & liquids, & containers containing such items
- Any recyclable materials or pieces less than 4" in size in any dimension
- Napkins, paper towels, tissue, paper plates, paper cups, & plastic utensils
- Window or auto glass
- Light bulbs
- Porcelain & ceramics
- Hoses, cords, wires
- Propane tanks (empty or not)
- Microwaveable trays, plastic or glass
- Coated cardboard and pizza boxes
- Coat hangers
- Yard waste, construction debris, and wood
- Batteries, any
- Needles, syringes, IV bags, or other medical supplies
- Textiles, cloth, or any fabric
- Plastic bags and bagged materials

Some non-recyclable materials—such as plastic bags or batteries—can be recycled elsewhere, just not in residential recycling. Please contact Public Works at 847.279.6900 or SWANCC at 847.724.9205 to determine what options, if any, are available.

Parkway Tree Planting

Parkway trees will be planted during May and June, weather permitting. If a parkway tree has been planted in front of your home, the following guidelines should be followed to assist in tree growth and a smooth transition to its new location.

- Each tree will receive a slow release watering bag that releases water through small holes. Residents are requested to fill these bags weekly until the bags are removed in the fall. Water during the first growing season is essential to the tree's ability to establish a healthy root system and overall tree health.
- If mulch is placed at the base of the tree, make sure not to mound the mulch too high against the tree trunk.
- Do not use fertilizers, pesticides, or weed control chemicals to treat the area immediately around the new tree.
- Do not prune the tree.

Do You Need a Permit?

Before you build or remodel structures within the Village, it is likely you will need to obtain a permit. The Building Division is involved from the plan review process through the final onsite inspection to make sure building and remodeling projects comply with current life-safety building codes. Permit forms are available on the Village's website. If you are unsure whether you are required to have a permit for work on your property, please inquire through Community Development at 847.459.2620.

Waste Management At Your Door Special Waste Collections

The Village recently approved a five-year extension with Waste Management (WM) for the collection of refuse, recycling, and yard waste for residents, and refuse and recycling for commercial establishments. The new contract takes effect on June 1, and includes a new program called At Your Door (AYD) for residents with curbside collections.

The AYD program provides residents an easy and convenient option to properly recycle household electronics and dispose of hazardous chemicals. The cost for the program is included in your monthly rate, and residents can utilize the program as many times during the year as necessary.

What materials are collected through the AYD Special Collection program?

Acceptable materials include, but may not be limited to, automotive products (antifreeze, batteries, brake fluid, motor oil & filters); garden chemicals (fertilizers, herbicides, pesticides, weed killers); paint products (paint, caulk, glue, stain, thinner, wood preservative); household cleaners (ammonia, cleaning products, rust remover, tile/shower and upholstery cleaners); items containing mercury (batteries, fluorescent lamps tubes, thermometers and thermostats); sharps (only if placed in sealed, rigid, puncture-resistant containers); and electronics (computers, monitors, keyboards, televisions, DVD/CD/VCR players, cell phones, printers, microwaves).

Ammunition, explosives, asbestos, tires, or any unlabeled or leaking materials will not be collected.

How do I schedule an AYD collection?

Call 1.800.449.7587, M-F from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m.; or visit www.wmatyourdoor.com and submit a request form.

Please have the list of unwanted materials ready for their information.

What happens when I schedule a collection?

A collection kit will be sent via mail. The kit consists of a plastic bag, bag tie, survey card, labels, and an instruction sheet. Follow the directions for appropriate packaging and collection. If the materials for collection are not labeled, are leaking, or for some reason are not acceptable, a door hanger will be left with further instructions. When the package is ready for collection, place the package outdoors near the side door or by the garage on the specific designated collection date provided by WM. You do not need to be present during collections. Do not place the package near the curb or street.

Summer Watering Restrictions

The Village's has even-odd address watering restriction is in effect from May 15 through September 15.

- Residents with street addresses that end with an even number (0, 2, 4, 6, and 8) can only water on even-numbered calendar days.
- Residents with street addresses that end with an odd number (1, 3, 5, 7, and 9) can only water on odd-numbered calendar days.
- Watering is prohibited from 12–6 p.m. every day.

The watering of newly laid sod is permitted at any time and on any day upon the issuance of an appropriate permit, and for a time not to exceed two consecutive weeks. Contact the Department of Community Development with any questions about water restrictions at 847.459.2620.

Annual Water Report

The Consumer Confidence Report (CCR), also called the annual water report, is a document that provides consumers information about the source and quality of their local drinking water. According to the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency Consumer Confidence Report Rule, every community water supplier must provide an annual report by July 1 of each year for the previous year's information. The CCR summarizes chemical and bacteriological contaminants, regulation compliances, educational health information, and water system contact information. The CCR can be found at:






