From the Desk of President Horcher

Summer is in full swing here in Wheeling, bringing with it longer days to enjoy our many family-friendly parks, dine outdoors at one of our world-class restaurants, or beat the heat at the newly reoccupied Cinergy cinema (formerly CMX) in the Wheeling Town Center. The Village Board and I are thrilled to welcome Cinergy to the great group of tenants already located in our Town Center. By the time you're reading this newsletter, Cinergy should be opening its doors for movie viewing and dining for the whole family. In the coming months they plan to incorporate

arcade games and other amenities, in keeping with their family entertainment center concept offered nationwide.



If you're looking for a new dining location—perhaps one with a patio!—be sure to check out our user-friendly Interactive Dining Guide at www.wheelingil.gov/dining where you can view over 100 food and beverage options available in Wheeling. Check back periodically as there are always new restaurants opening, such as District Brew Yards, coming to 700 N. Milwaukee later this year in the space formerly occupied by Ram Restaurant & Brewery. Also later this year we'll be welcoming West Town Bakery to the space formerly occupied by Twin Peaks restaurant at 781 N. Milwaukee Avenue. The Village is working hard to fill empty storefronts and bring a diversity of dining and entertainment options to our residents and visitors.

To that end, the Restaurant Row Corridor Plan project is moving forward as the Village's consultant, Lakota Group, continues to create a plan for a re-imagined Milwaukee Avenue corridor. A community workshop will be taking place this summer to review the group's progress and gain more public input to help shape the future of our Restaurant Row. And it's not just commercial areas that are seeing improvements. In May, members of the Village Board and I were honored to attend the ribbon-cutting ceremony for the recently reconstructed Lake Cook Road corridor project. Every commuter who has traversed this major corridor over the past two and a half years has had to maintain patience while this much-needed reconstruction took place. As one of only four major east-west routes in Wheeling, Lake Cook Road is vital to our commercial and residential traffic flow. And as we've all learned over the course of the pandemic, being able to quickly and easily transport goods is crucially important, and infrastructure improvements such as these greatly improve our local businesses' ability to do so. The Board and I are grateful to the Cook County Board of Commissioners and Department of Transportation & Highways for recognizing the need for these improvements and following through on their commitment to fund the project.

Thanks in part to Rebuild Illinois funds, several major infrastructure projects are taking place around town; some are wrapping up and some are just getting underway. Wolf Road reconstruction has moved into its fourth and final stage, and reconstruction on Northgate Parkway and Wheeling Road is in the beginning stages. I know no one looks forward to road construction season, but I think we can all agree that once completed, the benefits outweigh the temporary headaches. I thank all of you for your patience while we undertake these improvements.

Health Happenings

Community Blood Drive

The Wheeling Board of Health is hosting a blood drive from 2 to 7 p.m. on Wednesday, July 6 at the Village Hall. Appointments are recommended but not required. Face masks are optional.



Blood donors of all types are needed for critically ill patients, accident victims, people needing surgery, and patients suffering from chronic diseases such as cancer and leukemia. Every pint of blood donated will help save three lives!

Medication/Sharps Collection

Medication and sharps collections for all residents are held on the third Saturday of every month from 10 a.m. until 12 p.m. in front of the Police Station at 1 Community Boulevard. We accept prescription and over-the-counter medications in their original containers with labels to identify contents (no over-the-counter liquid medications or controlled substances), sharps (needles and syringes) in rigid containers with a sealed lid, and glasses, including eyeglasses, sunglasses, and telescopic, magnifying, and prescription glasses. Children's glasses are especially needed and will be given to a program called "Recycle for Sight" which refurbishes eyeglasses for those in need.

Assist Homebuyer Program

The Village of Wheeling offers the Assist homebuyer's program—which provides families with funds to pay all or most of their closing costs and down payment—and the mortgage credit certificate (MCC) program, which reduces the homebuyer's ongoing cost of borrowing.

What is Assist?

Assist offers a 30-year fixed-rate mortgage and 3-7% cash assistance on the amount borrowed to qualified homebuyers. The cash assistance may be used to offset some or all of the home loan's down payment and closing costs.

What are Mortgage Credit Certificates?

MCCs reduce effective interest costs for qualifying homebuyers. MCCs allow the homebuyer to qualify for a federal income tax credit equal to a percentage of the interest paid on their home loan each year. MCC holders still qualify for a regular deduction of the remaining interest paid on their home loan.

Fraud Alert!

Imagine this: you receive a call claiming to be from the IRS or immigration, and the caller says you owe taxes or your immigration status is jeopardized. You must pay a fine or back taxes immediately through a prepaid debit card, wire transfer card, Apple gift card, or other gift card, otherwise you will be arrested immediately. The number even looks like it is coming from Washington D.C. or the local law enforcement/IRS office.

This is a scam. No government agency will ask you to make payment through a gift card or wire transfer. If you are unsure of the legitimacy of the caller, notify the police.

School Zone Safety Reminder



With in-person school resuming in August, the Wheeling Police want to remind you of the following:

School Zones: The speed limit in all Wheeling school zones is 20 miles per hour. "School Days" are defined as 7 a.m. – 4 p.m on days when school is in session and children are present on the sidewalks or in the area.

Stopping for Loading and Unloading School Buses: Illinois law requires that drivers *stop* and *not pass* school buses that have their red lights flashing with the stop sign arm extended. Vehicles that are in oncoming traffic in relation to a stopped school bus on a four-lane roadway are not required to stop under the law.

Disobeying a Crossing Guard: Illinois law makes disobeying a Crossing Guard a *moving violation*. A court appearance by the violator is required.

Cellular Phones: Cellular phone use when driving is prohibited by state law. Cellular phones may NOT be used in *any mode* in school zones or construction zones. This means that you cannot even use a cell phone in Bluetooth or hands-free mode in either location.

Texting While Driving: Texting while driving is *prohibited at all times* throughout the state of Illinois. The law defines texting as "electronic mail, a text message, an instant message or a command or request to access an internet site."

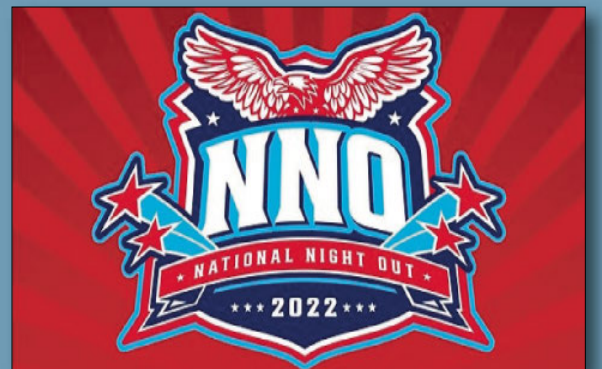

File of Life

File of Life is a simple way to communicate your important emergency medical information with life safety personnel. This is very important if you are unconscious or unable to speak to the emergency responders when they arrive. Without a list of medications, allergies, and medical history, as well as who to call, paramedics are typically forced to look for medicine bottles for answers. The paramedics then try to figure out what the problem might be based on the medicines they find. The File of Life saves valuable time in an emergency situation. The file folds in half, goes into a red plastic envelope with a magnet on the back, and is placed on the refrigerator where paramedics know to look for it. If you are interested in a File of Life, you may stop by Human Services at 1 Community Boulevard or Fire Station 24 on Milwaukee Avenue to obtain one.

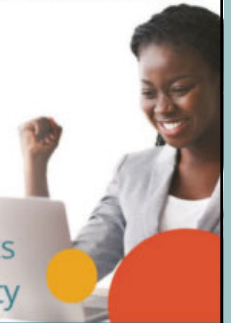

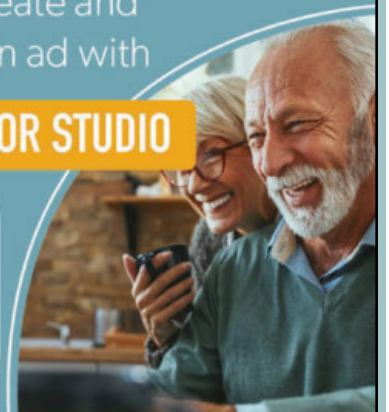

Current Construction Projects

Street Improvement Program

The Village's Motor Fuel Tax (MFT) Street Improvement Program is scheduled to take place within the Zelosky's, Candlewood Creek and Picardy Place, Equestrian, Forest Edge, and Woodvale subdivisions, totaling an estimated 14,561 lineal feet of improvements. This project will involve removal, adjustment, and/or replacement of pavement, curb and gutter, sidewalks, storm sewer, drainage structures, and private driveways as well as parkway restoration.

The MFT street improvement program is an annual project managed by Public Works with funding derived from gasoline taxes collected by the State of Illinois and subsequently distributed to municipalities throughout Illinois. Public Works expects the project to be completed by mid-October 2022, weather permitting. The project will temporarily adversely impact local traffic in the areas named above. Crack Sealing Program

The Village's Crack Sealing Program is scheduled to take place on various streets throughout the community beginning in July and concluding by August, weather permitting. The primary goal of this treatment is to prevent the infiltration of water into the sub-base of the roadway, ultimately reducing replacement costs and extending the life of the pavement. Crack sealing involves routing each existing crack in the pavement and filling it with an asphalt sealant. Residents can expect some dust and debris during the routing process. We recommend keeping pets inside, closing your windows, and parking any vehicles in a garage if feasible. Your patience and understanding during this process is appreciated. Rebuild Illinois Grant Program

Passed in 2019 by the State of Illinois, the Rebuild Illinois Grant Program allocated funds to rebuild roads, bridges, transit, waterways, freight and passenger rail, aviation, and bicycle and pedestrian accommodations. These grants allow communities to invest in their local infrastructure, improve safety, enhance quality of life, and sustain the economy by means of jobs and employment. The Village has received Rebuild Illinois funding and is applying the funds toward various projects. Additional funding, such as the Surface Transportation Program (STP), may supplement projects.

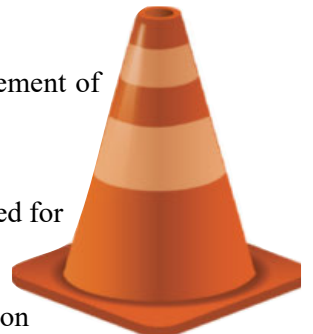
Northgate Parkway (Dundee to Lake Cook): This project will include the mill and overlay of existing asphalt pavement, as well as some storm sewer improvements, totaling an estimated cost of \$880,000. Phase I (Planning / Preliminary Engineering) of the project is nearly complete and Phase II (Design) will be completed by autumn 2022. The project bid letting is tentative for spring of 2023, with project construction expected in summer of 2023.

Chaddick Drive (Hintz to Marquardt): This project encompasses street overlay, totaling an estimated \$820,000. Phase I (Planning / Preliminary Engineering) and Phase II (Design) are nearly complete. The project bid letting is tentative for December 2022 / January 2023, with project construction in summer of 2023.

Public Information Meeting: Improvement of Wheeling Road from Palatine Road to Dundee Road

The Village of Wheeling will hold a Public Information Meeting concerning the proposed improvement of Wheeling Road from Palatine Road to Dundee Road. This meeting will be held at the Village Hall (2 Community Boulevard) on Thursday, July 14 from 5 until 7 p.m.

Representatives of the Village will be available to answer questions and address topics such as the need for the project, the design process, right-of-way acquisition, and a tentative target construction schedule. Preliminary reports and an engineering analysis with drawings, maps, and aerial images will be available for inspection and viewing. The same material is currently available for review and inspection at the Village of Wheeling. For more information, contact Public Works at 847.279.6900.

Waste Management Annual Rate Increase

Effective June 1, 2022 through May 31, 2023, new monthly rates for once-weekly collections for residents are:

Seniors must complete an application for senior discount, with proof of age (such as a copy of valid driver's license or state-issued identification card with current address) and a copy of a current WM bill that shows you as the account holder and lists your address. Applications and further information can be found at www.wheelingil.gov or by contacting Public Works at 847.279.6900.

One discount is available per household. No retroactive discounts are provided. If you are already receiving the discount, no need to re-apply. For single-family home residents, to determine if you are already receiving the discount, please review your WM bill, which should indicate "Discount (sr)" in the description portion of the bill. Or contact WM directly at 1.800.796.9696. If you pay your bill through a homeowner's association, please contact the association directly.

Wheeling residents and businesses can access solid waste information and services online through WM's local website. Customers can update their information, receive paperless billing, make online bill payments, view collection schedules, request cart repairs, schedule bulk collections, receive information on potential delays, and more. Multi-Family Electronics Recycling & Hazardous Waste Disposal

Residents in multi-family homes and/or properties, *without curbside collection*, may recycle electronic waste (e-waste) with the Solid Waste Agency of Northern Cook County (SWANCC). SWANCC hosts weekly electronic collections for residents of Wheeling and other SWANCC communities. IDs will be checked to confirm residency. Please do not drop off any electronics other than at the designated day and time. There is no fee for this service, and unloading assistance is provided.

Multi-family residents also have the opportunity to dispose of household hazardous waste (HHW) properly through the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency (IEPA). Acceptable materials include aerosol paints, antifreeze, cleaning products, drain cleaners, fluorescent bulbs, gasoline, herbicides, hobby chemicals, insecticides, lawn chemicals, medications, mercury, oil-based paint, paint thinners, pesticides, pool chemicals, solvents, and used motor oil. Latex paint is not accepted.

Below are four drop-off locations for HHW. Please contact locations to confirm hours and materials accepted. *Business or institutional waste is not accepted.*

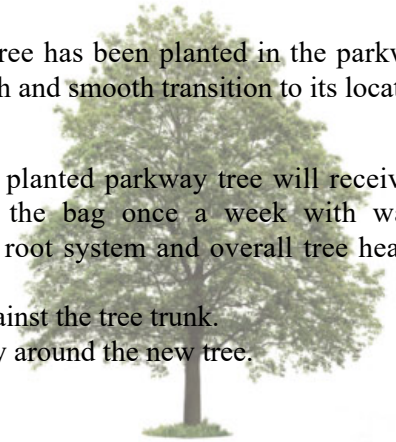

Parkway Tree Reminder

Recently the Village's contractor planted parkway trees throughout the Village. If a tree has been planted in the parkway adjacent to your property, please follow these guidelines to assist in continued tree growth and smooth transition to its location within the street parkway:

- Watering is a key component to the survival of any newly planted tree. Each newly planted parkway tree will receive a slow-release watering bag that holds approximately 15 gallons of water. Filling the bag once a week with water during the first growing season is essential to the tree's ability to establish a healthy root system and overall tree health. Residents are asked to fill these bags weekly until the bags are removed in the fall.
- If mulch is placed at the base of the tree, make sure not to mound the mulch too high against the tree trunk.
- Do not use fertilizers, pesticides, or weed control chemicals to treat the area immediately around the new tree.
- Do not prune the tree.

Fireworks are Illegal in the Village of Wheeling

Each year almost 10,000 people in the United States are injured by fireworks, and approximately 10 people die from their injuries. Many require hospitalization as well as extensive reconstructive surgery. Tragically, almost 50% of all individuals who are injured by fireworks are under 21 years of age.

In the Village of Wheeling, it is illegal to sell, use, or explode fireworks, except professionally-licensed and approved public displays. Individuals who violate this law are subject to prosecution. It may be tempting to create your own display but this is unsafe and illegal!

Prohibited items include but are not limited to explosive shells, firecrackers, torpedoes, skyrockets, bottle rockets, and roman candles. Items containing less than .25 grain of an explosive mixture (ex. snappers, party poppers, caps, etc.) are permitted and are a safe alternative.

Please do your part in making the July 4th holiday a safe one by not conducting a fireworks display in your backyard or driveway.



Summer Property Maintenance

Community Development property maintenance staff will be out in force this summer, ensuring that properties in our community are observing the following property maintenance requirements:

- Maintain grass and weeds (maximum height eight inches).
- Maintain shrubs and trees, including removal or pruning of dead, overgrown, or improperly-maintained plants.
- Keep building exteriors free of cracked and peeling paint.
- Keep fences, sheds, and accessory structures in good repair.
- Stow garbage cans in the garage or adjacent to the house in a side or rear yard between pickup days.

If you notice ill-kept properties in your neighborhood, please contact Community Development at 847.459.2620 or our anonymous Code Hotline at 847.459.CODE (2633) so our staff can investigate the status of the properties and take steps to re-establish maintenance.

Reminder: Summer Watering Restrictions

To further water conservation efforts, the Village has implemented an even-odd address watering restriction which is in effect from May 15 through September 15.

- Residents with street addresses that end with an **even number** (0, 2, 4, 6, and 8) can only water on even-numbered calendar days.
- Residents with street addresses that end with an **odd number** (1, 3, 5, 7, and 9) can only water on odd-numbered calendar days.
- Watering is prohibited from 12–6 p.m. every day.

The watering of newly-laid sod is permitted at any time and on any day upon the issuance of an appropriate permit, and for a time not to exceed two consecutive weeks. Contact the Department of Community Development with any questions about water restrictions at 847.459.2620.

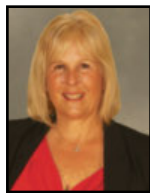

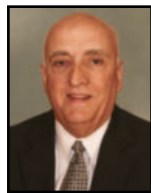
