## From the Desk of President Horcher

On behalf of the Village of Wheeling, please allow me to wish you a very happy New Year! I and the members of the Village Board enjoyed sharing holiday cheer with everyone who attended the Lights Around Wheeling event in November, including dignitaries such as Illinois 29th District State Senator Julie Morrison and Cook County 14th District Commissioner Scott Britton.

We're particularly grateful to Wheeling's own Mike Moran, recipient of the Village's 2022 George Hieber Citizenship Award, who flipped the switch to light the holiday lights—another good deed in a distinguished record of service that includes a long tenure on the Village's Board of Fire & Police Commissioners, which he currently chairs. Mike has also worked to support the Illinois Fire Safety Alliance's Camp "I Am Me"—which provides children and teenagers who have experienced injuries from burns with a safe and judgment-free weeklong camp experience—spearheading numerous pig-roast fundraisers over many years for this worthy cause.

In with the new year come new businesses, perhaps most notably District Brew Yards, the collective-production brewery and beer hall now open at 700 North Milwaukee Avenue, formerly RAM Restaurant and Brewery. Across the street from the brewery, Starbucks is now operating in its new building by the Westin hotel, and Okay Dispensary and its affiliate West Town Bakery are in the process of occupying the former Twin Peaks site. Travelers on the Dundee Road corridor have no doubt noticed significant progress on several projects, from the Popeyes restaurant at the east end of town to the London Crossing mixed-use development on the west side, as well as activity near the Metra station that includes work on Union Apartments on Wheeling Road and intersection improvements at Northgate Parkway by Uptown 500.

The opening of District Brew Yards and the recent or upcoming arrivals of several other dining establishments on Milwaukee Avenue give us an occasion to mention another milestone achievement from late last year: the Village's adoption of the Restaurant Row Corridor Plan. Among the priorities identified in our Strategic Plan is "maintaining Restaurant Row as a source of community pride in a changing marketplace," and toward that end in 2021 the Village hired a team of skilled consultants headed by the Lakota Group to study the Milwaukee Avenue corridor—a process that included surveys, open houses, and interviews with stakeholders—and create a master plan to achieve a vibrant future for the properties along this thoroughfare.

The study is now complete, and I'd encourage everyone to visit the Village's website at [wheelingil.gov/979/Wheeling-Restaurant-Row-Corridor-Plan](http://wheelingil.gov/979/Wheeling-Restaurant-Row-Corridor-Plan) to take a look at it. Although the success of Restaurant Row is largely measured by the prosperity of the hospitality businesses that define its character, the new plan suggests many initiatives that the Village might undertake to encourage placemaking and improve connectivity and public spaces throughout the corridor. We look forward to exploring these possibilities in the months and years to come.

We'll keep providing updates on these and other projects as we all settle into 2023. Until then, have a happy and healthy New Year!

## Down Payment and Mortgage Assistance Programs Now Available to Wheeling Residents

### Illinois Housing Development Authority Mortgage Assistance Program

The Illinois Housing Development Authority (IHDA) announced it is reopening a mortgage assistance program designed to assist homeowners financially impacted by the pandemic. The Illinois Homeowner Assistance Fund (ILHAF) provides up to \$30,000 in mortgage assistance to eligible homeowners — paid directly to the servicer, taxing body, or other approved entity — while homeowners work to regain their financial footing. Whether homeowners have a mortgage, a reverse mortgage, or are mortgage-free, the program can fund past-due housing payments and up to three months of prospective mortgage payments. The program is free, and funds do not need to be repaid. The application, program information, and updates can be found at [illinoishousinghelp.org](http://illinoishousinghelp.org). Applications will be accepted until 11:59 p.m. on Tuesday, January 31, 2023. ### Assist Homebuyer Program

The Village of Wheeling now offers a two-pronged approach to assist homebuyers. The Assist program provides families with funds to pay all or most of their closing costs and down payment, and the mortgage credit certificate (MCC) program reduces the homebuyer's ongoing cost of borrowing.

#### What is Assist?

Assist is a program that offers individuals and families with 30-year fixed-rate mortgages and offers 3-7% cash assistance on the amount borrowed on a mortgage to qualified homebuyers. The cash assistance may be used to offset some or all of the home loan's down payment and closing costs. Assist minimizes the amount of money you need on hand to purchase your home.

#### What are Mortgage Credit Certificates?

MCCs are a federally authorized program created as an alternative to tax-exempt housing bonds to reduce effective interest costs for qualifying homebuyers. MCCs allow the homebuyer to qualify for a federal income tax credit equal to a percentage of the interest paid on their home loan each year. MCC holders still qualify for a regular deduction of the remaining interest paid on their home loan.

## New Smoke Detector Law in Illinois

A fire in the home is something nobody ever thinks will happen to them. But unfortunately, it does happen. In 2021, local fire departments responded to 1,353,500 fires nationwide, resulting in property loss of \$25.9 billion, 3,800 civilian fatalities, and 14,700 civilian injuries. Closer to home, in 2022, there were 83 total fires, 36 of them structure fires, here in Wheeling, and fortunately no fire fatalities. Despite being available for almost 50 years and being relatively inexpensive, smoke detectors are either absent or not working in almost 50% of these fires. With today's synthetic fabrics, high use of composite wood, and the extensive amount of plastics in our homes, when a fire does occur, occupants may have less than a minute to react and safely escape. Early detection and warning of a fire may really be the difference between life and death.



**Beginning January 1, 2023, all residential buildings will require operational smoke detectors.**

The absence of smoke detectors or having non-working smoke detectors in residences is not limited to the Village of Wheeling; it is a state and national issue as well. To address this problem, the State of Illinois has enacted legislation making it a statewide requirement that by January 1, 2023, every residential occupancy must have operational smoke detectors installed, and if they are battery-operated units, they must have a pre-installed 10-year life battery (i.e. a newer style of smoke detector). Failure to comply can result in fines and/or being charged with a Class A or Class B misdemeanor. In the event of fire fatality, additional criminal charges are possible. Failure to have a working smoke detector may also affect your ability to recover funds from your homeowner's or renter's insurance company if you suffer a loss.

Beyond obeying the law, having working smoke detectors in your home is just good common sense. Your life and the lives of your family members are well worth the investment. If you have smoke detectors and they are over 10 years old or are the type that requires you to annually change the batteries in them, now is a great time to replace them with new units with sealed, pre-installed 10-year life batteries. You will be better protected, you will be in compliance with the new law, and you will likely save money over the 10-year life of the new smoke detector by not having to install new batteries each year. Smoke detectors are a noise you can really live with.

## Street Parking After a Snowstorm

With bad weather around the corner, please remember that the Village of Wheeling has an ordinance stating that “it is unlawful to park any motor vehicle on any street within the village at any time within eight hours after a snow fall of two inches or more.”

During big snowstorms, many vehicles are often left parked on the street in violation of the ordinance, preventing the Village snow plows from being able to remove snow and to salt the roadways. Many tickets are issued to the vehicle owners in these instances.

In an effort to avoid this happening again, we remind drivers that they cannot park on the street after a snow event of two inches or more so that the snow can be safely removed and the streets salted by the Village’s plows. Please find alternative parking until eight hours after the snowfall has elapsed. Otherwise, parking tickets could be the result.

## Improve Traffic Flow: Lining up at a Turn Arrow

How many times have you been waiting in your car to turn left, and when the light changes only two or three cars make it through before the light turns red again? Most intersections work off a “trip system,” meaning that a series of wires in the pavement tells the light system how many cars are waiting and adjusts the light accordingly to allow the movement of those vehicles. The “trips” are a series of electrical circuits, each one activated by the previous one. Once a trip is not activated (no vehicle on the trip) the circuit is broken, and the light timing is set.

So how should you be a courteous driver in intersections that use a trip system?

- Pull all the way up to the wide white stop line if you are the first vehicle in line.
- Pull your vehicle up to the vehicle in front of you; DO NOT leave a large space between vehicles.
- Make sure that you are centered in your lane of traffic.

When you follow these steps, more vehicles will make it through the light and traffic will flow better.

## REMINDER: Texting 9-1-1 Available in Wheeling

Wheeling residents have the option of texting 9-1-1 to request emergency assistance, a valuable service for people who are deaf or hard of hearing, who have a speech disability, or who are in a situation in which making a call could be dangerous. Verizon, Sprint, AT&T, and T-Mobile customers are able to text their exact location and the nature of their emergency to 9-1-1, and a telecommunicator will respond.



Texting 9-1-1 does have its limitations. Making a phone call is still the best option when possible, because it allows the caller to relay information more quickly. When you make a voice call to 9-1-1, the telecommunicator will typically instantly receive your phone number and your approximate location. In most cases, however, text messages do not automatically provide this type of information to telecommunicators. As is the case with all text messages, text messages to 9-1-1 can take longer to get through, they may be delivered out of order, and in some cases they may not be received at all.

Text to 9-1-1 is not available when you are in a “roaming” situation. A text or data plan is required to place a text to 9-1-1; third-party texting applications are not compatible. Photos and videos cannot be sent to 9-1-1 at this time. Text-to-9-1-1 cannot include more than one person; do not copy your emergency text to anyone other than 9-1-1. Do not text and drive!

### How do I text to 9-1-1?

- 1) Enter the numbers 911 in the “To” or “Recipient” field;
- 2) Text in English using no abbreviations or slang.
- 3) Text your exact location including your town and ask for police, fire, or ambulance.
- 4) Push the “Send” button.
- 5) Answer questions and follow instructions from the 9-1-1 call taker.

Texting is not available everywhere. Anyone who texts 9-1-1 in an area where call centers do not support texts will receive a bounce-back message informing them that the text has not been sent and that they should try to call 9-1-1 instead.

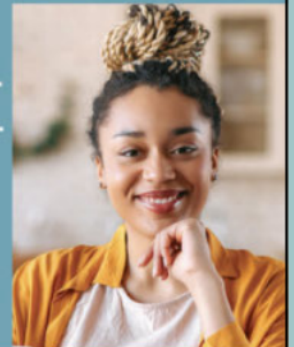

# COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT & PUBLIC WORKS

## Snow Season Procedures

Public Works snow and ice responsibilities include roadway de-icing and clearing arterial, collector, and residential roadways, certain sections of public sidewalks, the train station, and Village-owned buildings and properties. Public Works is not responsible for the maintenance of or snow control on county- or state-owned roadways or rights-of-way. These roadways include:

### Illinois Department of Transportation (IDOT) 847-705-4222

- Dundee Road (Route 68)
- Milwaukee Avenue (Route 21)
- Palatine Road including East and West Palatine frontage
- Wolf Road (Manchester North to Milwaukee Avenue; South of Marquardt to Camp McDonald Road)
- Elmhurst Road (Route 83)
- McHenry Road (Route 83)

### Cook County Highway Department 847-827-1164

- Lake-Cook Road
- Hintz Road
- Buffalo Grove Road
- Aptakisic Road
- Schoenbeck Road
- Camp McDonald Road
- Old Buffalo Grove Road

### Residents are advised of the following safety tips during the snow season:

- Stay 100 feet or more behind a snowplow or salt truck.
- When it is safe, shovel snow away from fire hydrants near your property for emergency access.
- Do not place refuse, refuse containers, or any other items in the street.

### Vehicle Parking Restrictions

- Do not park on any Village street within eight hours after a snowfall of two inches or more to allow safe and efficient snow and ice control by Public Works.
- Vehicles in violation of this restriction may be towed by the Police Department.

### Sidewalk Requirements

- Residents and property owners are responsible for clearing snow and ice from sidewalks adjoining or adjacent to their property by 10 a.m. the day after a snowfall. Property owners are permitted to spread sand, salt, or other substances made for the purpose of melting snow and ice on sidewalks.
- Residents and property owners shall not deposit snow or ice onto any roadway within the Village; instead, deposit snow and ice onto the parkway.

## Protect Water Lines from Freezing

Follow these measures to protect water lines from freezing and prevent water pipes from rupturing during extreme cold:

- Monitor water meters: Wrap water meters with foam insulation or heat tape if located in unheated or colder areas such as crawlspaces. Periodically check your meter and associated piping for cracks or leaks and ensure proper marking and operation of the shut-off valve in case a pipe bursts.
- Eliminate drafts: All crawlspace and basement vents, windows, and doors should be repaired and closed, making sure a tight seal exists to keep out cold air.
- Insulate pipes: Insulating pipes in colder or unheated areas such as the crawlspace, or pipes located adjacent to an outside wall, helps to reduce the possibility of ruptured pipes. Allow warm air to circulate around pipes accessible by cabinets and located against outside walls.
- Leave faucets running: A continuous trickle of cold water can help reduce the possibility of a pipe bursting due to freezing.

8 If you know that a property has been unoccupied for several days, contact Public Works at 847.279.6900 so they can verify if water services are shut off at the property. This can prevent costly damage to the unoccupied property.

With the arrival of winter, our municipal inspectors would like to remind all landlords and residential property owners that per Village Code 15.16.001 (d), heat must be supplied to your building from September 15–May 15 and kept at a temperature no lower than 68 degrees. ## Public Works Seasonal Positions

The Department of Public Works frequently has temporary, seasonal positions available during the summer for individuals interested in acquiring experience in the profession. These positions perform diverse duties with the majority of work outdoors and occasional indoor work. Duties include assisting with streets, litter collection, parkway restorations, sign maintenance, water and sewer maintenance, facilities, light clerical, etc. as well as other work assigned. Applicants are required to be 18 years old or older, have a high school diploma or equivalent, successfully pass a mandatory medical exam including drug screening, have a valid Illinois driver's license, and be able to lift, carry, and handle objects that weigh up to 50 lbs.

## Buried Hydrants

Heavy snowfall or snow plowed from roadways can bury hydrants, thus making it difficult to find and use them during firefighting.

The Public Works and Fire Departments seek assistance from residents and businesses in uncovering buried hydrants that are closest to their property. In doing so, we ask that snow be removed approximately three feet away from the hydrant in all directions, and a pathway cleared between the hydrant and the nearest roadway. Exercise caution when clearing around the hydrant because of the potential for vehicle traffic nearby. Do not stand in the street and be careful not to slip and fall into the roadway. 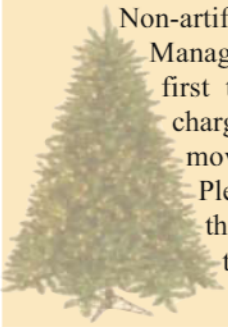

## Holiday Recycling Programs

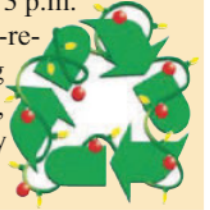
### Tree Collections

Non-artificial holiday trees are collected by Waste Management at residential curbsides during the first two weeks in January at no additional charge. All decorations, stands, etc. must be removed from trees for them to be collected. Please do not place trees in plastic bags. Trees that have decorations or are in stands or plastic bags will not be collected.



### Lights Recycling

Residents may recycle holiday lights including mini, C7, C9, rope, and LED lights and extension cords—all colors and lengths—at the Department of Public Works, 77 W. Hintz Road, Monday through Friday from 7 a.m. to 3 p.m. Garland, live greens, wreaths, and other non-recyclables are not accepted in this recycling program. The program concludes January 31, 2023. ## Code RED Emergency Notification System Enrollment

During a disaster situation such as a tornado, major chemical release, or freight train derailment, having the ability to receive important information and updates from the Village of Wheeling could prove critical to your well-being. When everyone had a home telephone, the Village operated a system referred to as Reverse 9-1-1. This system was based on static geographic areas for calling resident home telephones. Today, more and more families have given up their home telephones and rely only on cellular telephones and text messaging. To meet these growing means of alternate communication, the Village of Wheeling now operates what is referred to as the Code RED system.

The Code RED system is a secure internet-based system that the Village can use to notify residents in a geographic area within the Village, as well as to call and/or text registered cell phones. In order to receive these emergency notifications via call and/or text message, you must register for this service. There is no cost to sign up, and registration takes only a few minutes.

To register for emergency notifications from the Village's Code RED system, visit the Village's web page ([www.wheelingil.gov](http://www.wheelingil.gov)) and find the link under the "How Do I..." section, or go directly to the Village of Wheeling's Code RED system enrollment web page: <https://public.coderedweb.com/CNE/30CB8BCB2A7F>.

Once you register for the Code RED system, you can always log back in and amend your information, change your notification preferences, or remove yourself from the system completely at any time. Again, registration is free, easy, secure, and critical to the well-being of you and your family should a disaster occur.
