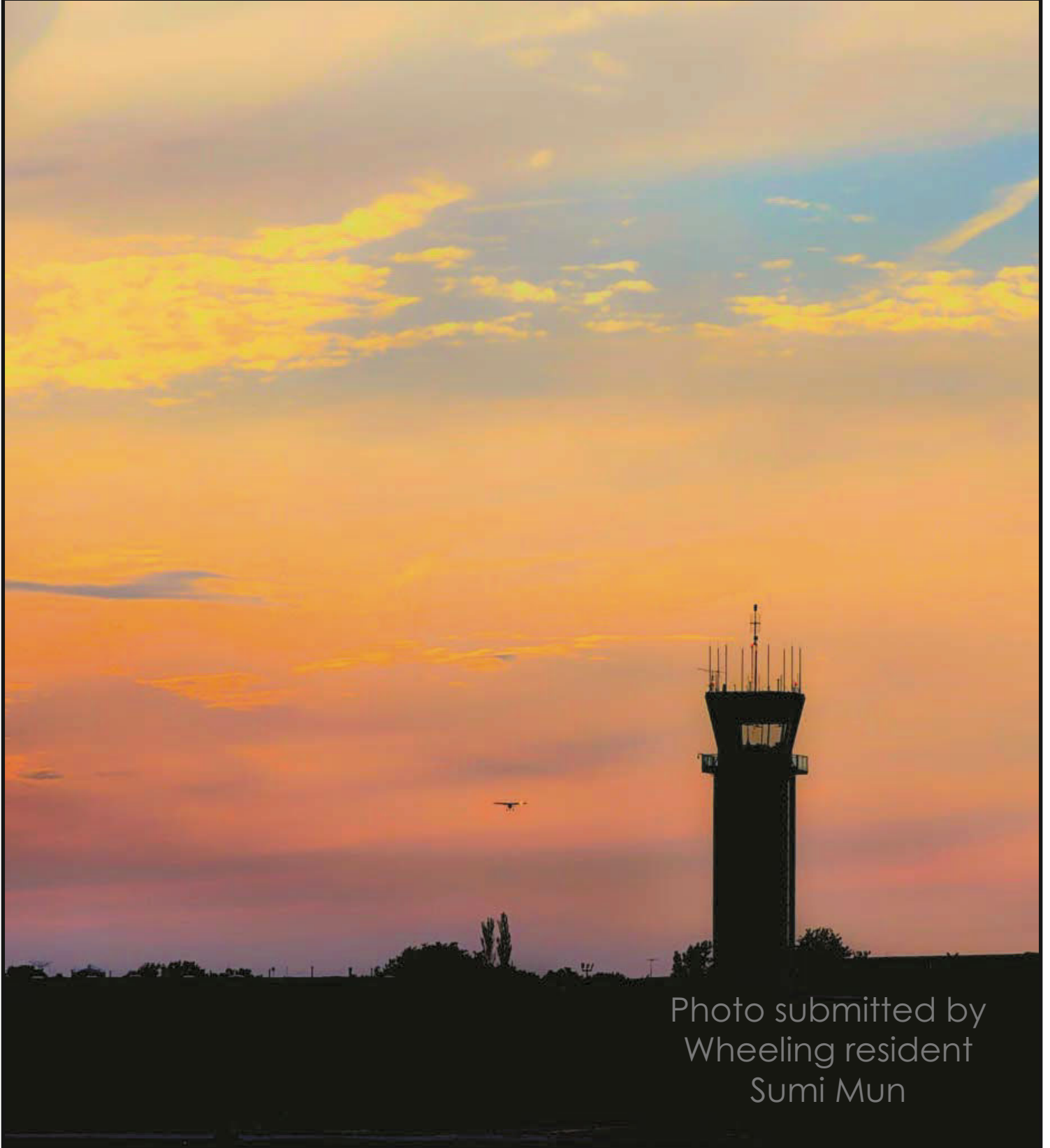

From the Desk of President Horcher

Many thanks to everyone who participated in the June 28 Rock 'n' Run the Runway events at Chicago Executive Airport! As always, the Village is grateful to the Airport and the City of Prospect Heights for their partnership, to our sponsors and contributors for their generosity, to the entertainers and food trucks, and to the Village staff for all their hard work prior to, during, and after the event. Stay tuned for updates to this event next year as we explore ways to celebrate Chicago Executive Airport's 100th anniversary!

Most of what the Village does on a day-to-day basis to make Wheeling a great place to live and work happens deep in the background, where hardly anyone notices it—and that's a good thing. But it's a pleasure to put on a show once in a while and see so many of the people we serve celebrating together.

Sometimes, of course, the work we do must become visible to the public in ways that are less entertaining. We're grateful for the community's patience as we complete several important infrastructure projects, the most notable being the replacement of watermain on Dundee Road, which has required lane and some full-street closures. Because this project requires cutting into the roadway, the Village has prioritized its completion ahead of the Illinois Department of Transportation's upcoming resurfacing of Dundee from Kennicott Avenue in Arlington Heights to Northgate Parkway in Wheeling which is planned for next year; we'll provide more updates on that construction as it draws closer.

Within Wheeling's neighborhoods we've also completed our annual Motor-Fuel-Tax-funded street improvement program—which this year included streets in the Dunhurst, Drake, Ridgefield, Pleasant Run, and Avalon subdivisions, as well as Horizon Trail—and begun the second phase of stormwater improvements in South Dunhurst, among other projects.

Not all of our recent work happened in physical space: we encourage you to visit the Village's redesigned website, www.wheelingil.gov when it goes live later this summer. We hope you'll find that it makes searching for what you need more easy, and our new chatbot provides quick answers to Village-related questions you might have.

The Village has also had notable business activity, which includes the recent announcement by Ala Carte Entertainment—parent company of the highly successful Moretti's restaurant in Wheeling Town Center—that it will purchase the vacant adjacent property to open the Wheel Haus, a gastropub and banquet space. This new business will be an important step in the continued transformation of the Town Center, and another great addition to Wheeling's famous community of restaurants.

Speaking of which, don't let these warm summer months pass you by without enjoying one of our many outdoor dining options—maybe before or after seeing a movie at Cinergy, catching a concert at the Town Center or the Heritage Park bandshell, or taking advantage of recreational options at Wheeling's outstanding Park District and Forest Preserve locations. And there are other community events to attend, including the Wheeling Police Department's National Night Out on Tuesday, August 5; please see Page Four of this newsletter for more details.

However you choose to spend your summer, we hope it's safe and enjoyable, and we look forward to providing more updates soon!

New Utility Billing Lockbox Address

The remittance address for the Village of Wheeling utility billing lockbox is changing on July 1, 2025. After that date, all payments should be made to the following address:

Village of Wheeling
PO Box 8972
Carol Stream, IL 60197-8972

A revised utility bill stub with the new address will be included in your bill in the future, along with a window envelope for mailing.

As of October 1, 2025, the processing system currently used for lockbox services will be discontinued. For a short time after that, any payments received at the old lockbox address will be forwarded to the new lockbox in Carol Stream.

If you pay your utility bill online through your bank's bill pay service, please update the billing address with your bank as soon as possible to avoid rejected payments and potential late fees after October 1st.

All online payments through InvoiceCloud, including auto-pay/Wheeling direct payments, will continue functioning as usual and will not be affected by this address change.

Waste Management Rates

Effective June 1, 2025, through May 31, 2026, the non-senior single family home rate (including SWANCC fee) will be \$23.69 per month, and the senior single family home rate (including SWANCC fee) will be \$18.89 per month.

School Zone Safety Reminder

With school resuming in August, the Wheeling Police want to remind you of the following:

School Zones: The speed limit in all Wheeling school zones is 20 miles per hour. "School Days" are defined as **7 a.m. – 4 p.m.** on days when school is in session and children are present on the sidewalks or in the area.

Stopping for Loading and Unloading School Buses: Illinois law requires that drivers *stop* and *not pass* school buses that have their red lights flashing with the stop-sign arm extended. Vehicles that are in oncoming traffic in relation to a stopped school bus on a four-lane roadway are not required to stop under the law.

Disobeying a Crossing Guard: Illinois law makes disobeying a Crossing Guard a *moving violation*. A court appearance by the violator is required.

Cellular Phones: Cellular phone use when driving is prohibited by state law. Cellular phones may NOT be used in *any mode* in school zones or construction zones. This means that you cannot even use a cell phone in Bluetooth or hands-free mode in either location.

Texting While Driving: Texting while driving is *prohibited at all times* throughout the state of Illinois. The law defines texting as "electronic mail, a text message, an instant message or a command or request to access an internet site."



Fireworks Are Illegal in the Village of Wheeling

In the Village of Wheeling, it is illegal to sell, use, or explode fireworks, except professionally-licensed and approved public displays. Individuals who violate this law are subject to prosecution. It may be tempting to create your own display, but this is unsafe and illegal!

Prohibited items include but are not limited to explosive shells, firecrackers, torpedoes, skyrockets, bottle rockets, and roman candles. Items containing less than .25 grain of an explosive mixture (ex. snappers, party poppers, caps, etc.) are permitted and are a safe alternative.

Please do your part in making the July 4th holiday a safe one by not conducting a fireworks display in your backyard or driveway.



Personal and Property Safety Tips

It is always important to take steps to protect yourself and your home. Here are some ways to do so.

Ways to Protect Your Property:

- Turn exterior lights on when it's dark outside, and use timers for interior lights when you're not home.
- Keep your home and car doors locked, even when you're home and awake.
- Remove valuables from your car.
- Don't advertise absences by posting vacation pictures on social media (wait to post until you're back home).
- Don't leave expensive items visible through windows, either in your home or vehicle.
- Install security cameras or a video doorbell.
- Keep bushes and trees trimmed near windows and doors to eliminate hiding places.

Ways to Protect Yourself:

- Be aware of your surroundings and avoid wearing headphones, or only wear an earbud in one ear.
- Vary your walking, jogging, or biking routes and stay in well-lit areas as much as possible.
- Avoid wearing excessive jewelry.
- Walk confidently and at a steady pace.
- Travel with a friend whenever possible.
- Carry a cell phone with you, but avoid distractions and limit use while walking.
- Trust your instincts.

Refuse and Recycling Guidelines Reminder

To keep our community attractive and to maintain healthy living conditions, residents are reminded of guidelines for solid waste at the curbside.

- All refuse, recycling, and landscape waste must be placed at the curb for collection no earlier than 5 p.m. the evening before and no later than 6 a.m. the day of a scheduled collection.
- All refuse, recycling, and yard waste must be placed inside designated containers with the lids completely closed for scheduled collections. A bulk waste item that does not fit in the designated garbage cart is the exception.
- All empty carts and refuse items not collected must be removed before 8 a.m. the day after a scheduled collection.
- On all other days, carts and bulk waste items shall be kept in the garage or adjacent to a principal structure within the side or rear yard of any lot only.

Parkway Tree Planting

A Village contractor has recently planted parkway trees throughout Wheeling as part of the spring program. To maintain a diverse urban forest, a variety of species were selected. The installation process can cause stress to a newly-planted tree, and the recovery rate and establishment ability can vary between species.

If a tree has been recently planted in the parkway next to your property, observing the following guidelines will assist continued tree growth and a smooth transition to its location within the street parkway:

- Watering is key to the survival of any newly-planted tree. Each newly-planted parkway tree will receive a slow-release watering bag that holds approximately 15 gallons of water. Filling the bag once a week with water during the first growing season is essential to the tree's ability to establish a healthy root system and overall tree health. Residents are asked to fill these bags weekly until the bags are removed in the fall.
- If mulch is placed at the base of the tree, make sure not to mound the mulch too high against the tree trunk.
- Do not use fertilizers, pesticides, or weed control chemicals to treat the area immediately around the new tree.
- Do not prune the tree.

Summer Watering Restrictions

To further water conservation efforts, the Village has implemented an even-odd address watering restriction which is in effect from May 15 through September 15.

- Residents with street addresses that end with an **even number** (0, 2, 4, 6, and 8) can only water on even-numbered calendar days.
- Residents with street addresses that end with an **odd number** (1, 3, 5, 7, and 9) can only water on odd-numbered calendar days.
- Watering is prohibited from 12–6 p.m. every day.

The watering of newly-laid sod is permitted at any time and on any day upon the issuance of an appropriate permit, and for a time not to exceed two consecutive weeks. Contact the Department of Community Development with any questions about water restrictions at 847.459.2620.

Northwest Mosquito Abatement District (NWMAD)

The NWMAD is a separate agency from the Village of Wheeling, specifically responsible for mosquito abatement. They cover approximately 242 square miles of Cook County, including Wheeling, and apply larvicide and adulticide as needed. ComEd Bill Impact - Bill Assistance and Energy Savings Programs

Rising energy costs can create real stress for individuals, families, and community organizations alike. As summer approaches, customers may see an increase in energy costs due to a recent energy capacity auction by PJM, the organization that manages the energy grid and electricity market in 13 states and Washington D.C., including northern Illinois, which resulted in higher energy supply costs. For customers who receive energy supply from ComEd, this cost is passed through with no markup by, or profit to, ComEd.

Through a suite of bill-assistance and energy-management programs, ComEd continues to support customers, particularly those vulnerable to economic hardships. These programs include:

Bill Assistance:

- Payment arrangements of up to 12 months for eligible residential customers with past-due balances.
- Fresh Start Services offers online and person-to-person support to help educate customers on energy-management and financial-assistance options.
- Catch Up and Save helps customers eliminate past-due balance and provides stabilized monthly billing through new enrollment in the Supplemental Arrearage Reduction Program.

Billing Options:

- Budget billing helps customers anticipate electric bill costs by providing them with a predictable monthly payment based on their electricity use from the last 12 months.
- Due date extensions of up to 21 days to help eligible customers avoid past-due balances.
- Deposit and late-payment charge waivers for one year to income-eligible customers, along with the return of any current deposit.

Energy Management:

- High-usage alerts enable customers to receive alerts when their usage is trending higher than normal to help manage overall energy use.
- Peak time savings enables customers to reduce their energy use during peak usage times and earn credit on future bills.
- Hourly pricing offers customers the opportunity to purchase electricity at the hourly market price.
- The ComEd Energy Efficiency Program offers award-winning energy-management solutions to help customers reduce overall costs, which helps them avoid falling behind on their electric bills.

Household Hazardous Waste At-Home Collection Program

The Solid Waste Agency of Northern Cook County (SWANCC) has partnered with Clean Harbors to provide Wheeling residents who have curbside refuse collection with an at-home pickup option to properly dispose of household hazardous waste.

The At-Home Collection Program includes automotive fluids, pesticides, cleaning fluids, and hobbyist materials, as well as other home-use chemicals.

How Does the Program Work?

1. Request a pickup, either by telephone at 866.466.5060 or at <https://form.jotform.com/242978262215158>
2. Provide an inventory of waste types and quantities to confirm that the materials are accepted in the program, and Clean Harbors will schedule the collection service based on their current workload and routing.
 - Clean Harbors will also assist with locating alternative outlets for waste that can be readily managed through other drop-off options (e.g., gasoline and motor oil that can be taken to a service station or repair shop) and for waste that is not accepted through the program.
3. Clean Harbors will provide preparation and set-out instructions and mail a heavy clear plastic bag and tie in advance of their collection day to contain materials. There is a 70 lb. weight limit per collection.

There is no cost to eligible residents. However, the Village will charge a \$75 fee if a cancellation occurs the day of a scheduled collection, or if no material is set out at the time the scheduled collection is made.

COMMUNITY NEWS & EVENTS

Current Construction Projects

Street Improvement Program

The Village's Motor Fuel Tax (MFT) Street Improvement Program took place within Dunhurst, Drake, Lemke Farms (Ridgefield), Pleasant Run, and Avalon subdivisions along with Horizon Trail, totaling an estimated 14,575 lineal feet of improvements. This project included removal, adjustment, and/or replacement of pavement, curb and gutter, sidewalks, storm sewer, drainage structures, and private driveways, as well as parkway restoration. The MFT Street Improvement Program is an annual project managed by Public Works with funding derived from gasoline taxes collected by the State of Illinois and subsequently distributed to municipalities. Dundee Road Water Main Replacement Project

The Dundee Road Water Main Replacement Project has begun at the railroad tracks, and extends to the 1300 block of West Dundee Road. The project includes installation of approximately 4,135 lineal feet of 12-inch, 10-inch and 8-inch diameter water main pipe, valve vaults, fire hydrants, pavement patching and other miscellaneous work on Dundee Road. The project is scheduled to be completed by July 2025.

South Dunhurst Phase II Storm Sewer Improvements

The South Dunhurst neighborhood experiences frequent significant flooding in low-lying areas along N. Green Drive, Bernice Court, Isa Drive, Audrey Lane, and E. Merle Lane. Phase 1 of the South Dunhurst Storm Sewer Improvements Project, which focused on constructing the detention pond north of Mark Twain Elementary School and installing storm sewer out to E. Merle Lane, was completed last year. Phase 2, which includes construction of the storm sewer collection pipes into the South Dunhurst subdivision, is scheduled to start this summer and be completed by the end of 2025. This project will adversely impact local traffic in this area.

Recycle Coach

Wheeling residents can access solid waste information through Recycle Coach, a free app that is available through desktop computers, laptops, and mobile devices.

Recycle Coach, a technology company in the field of waste management, partnered with the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency (IEPA) to provide residents with free access to a comprehensive tool to increase and improve recycling in communities. The app includes information from both the Village of Wheeling and the Solid Waste Agency of Northern Cook County (SWANCC).

The Recycle Coach provides:

- local recycling and disposal information
- customized curbside collection calendar including collection reminders
- disposal information for common and unique household items
- engaging and educational tools to boost recycling knowledge!



To get started, residents can download the Recycle Coach app through the Apple Store or Google Play, or visit www.wheelingil.gov/2233/Recycling-Coach for a QR code.

Thinking of replacing your mailbox?

Please be aware that Village code does not allow for the construction of any brick or other type of non-standard mailboxes within single-family neighborhoods. A standard mailbox is six to twelve inches off the back of the curb, with the support post being no closer than 18 inches off the back of curb, and that post can be no larger than a four-inch by four-inch wood post or two inch diameter steel or aluminum post.

These requirements are also in line with the United States Postal Service. If you have questions regarding mailbox construction please contact Community Development at 847.459.2620.

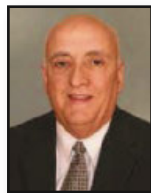
