

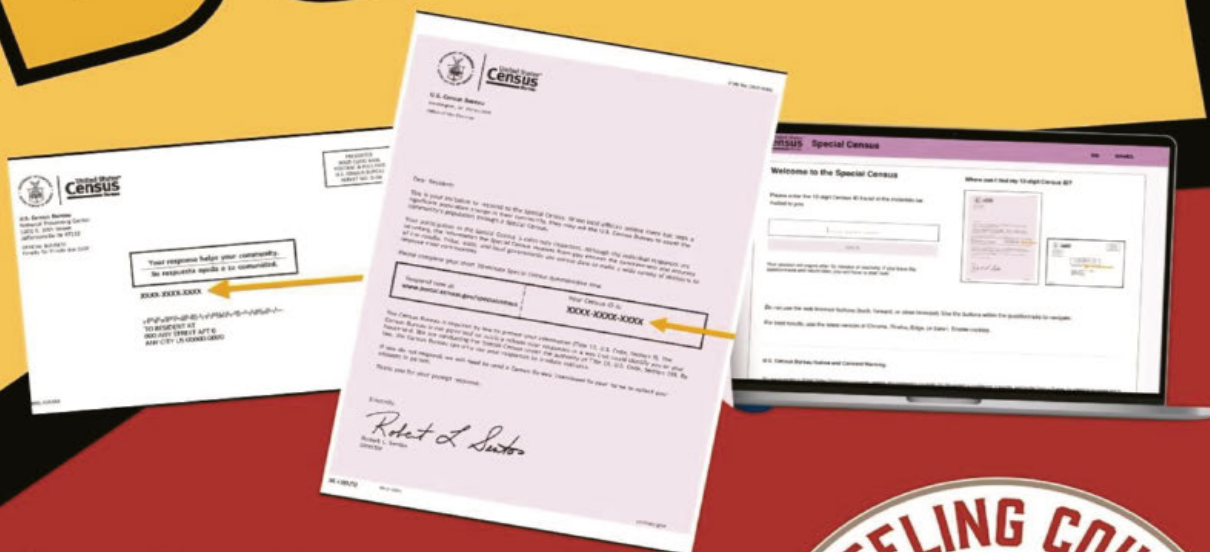

From the Desk of President Horcher

The Village has a lot of news to share as the summer nears an end! Most notably, in the months ahead we'll be working with the U.S. Census Bureau to conduct a Special Census that will account for the many new residents who have come to Wheeling as a result of all the new housing built since the most recent regular Census in 2020. Because population determines how state and federal resources and revenues are distributed, an accurate count is crucial to making sure Wheeling residents get their fair share. The data collected by the Special Census will be strictly confidential, and we strongly encourage everyone to respond. The Census Bureau is currently hiring for full- and part-time paid positions to assist with this important process; we urge Wheeling residents to apply at USAJobs.gov. As always, the Village is grateful for its productive relationships at every level of government. Wheeling recently received a visit from Illinois Governor JB Pritzker, who spoke at Community Consolidated School District 21's Community Service Center on August 11. The Village appreciates the Governor's attention to our community.

The Village has made progress on several projects since our last update, including the second phase of stormwater improvements in South Dunhurst. As you may recall, last year Phase One of this project constructed a stormwater detention basin north of Mark Twain Elementary School; Phase Two is extending storm-sewer pipes into the neighborhood to move runoff toward the basin. Once complete, the project will substantially reduce flooding in this area. As previously mentioned, the Village recently launched its redesigned website—which now includes an artificial-intelligence chat function, among many other features—at its existing address, www.wheelingil.gov. And we recently learned that the Village's dedicated economic development website, ChooseWheeling.com, has been recognized with an award from the International Economic Development Council.

In private-sector activity, the Gas N Wash redevelopment of the former Garden Fresh Market site at Hintz and Old Buffalo Grove Roads is now complete, bringing a group of brand-new businesses to a long-disused site. And Ala Carte Entertainment, operator of the thriving Moretti's restaurant in Wheeling Town Center, continues to work toward occupancy of the vacant adjacent property, where it now plans to open an outpost of its popular Finn McCool's Irish Sports Pub. We're looking forward to its opening in the near future!

We're also looking forward to some upcoming seasonal events. The Village's annual Community Breakfast will take place on Saturday, October 4; please see the flyer on page 9 of this newsletter for more information. Halloween trick-or-treating will take place during the customary hours of 3–7 p.m. Please enjoy the holiday responsibly! And the annual Lights Around Wheeling holiday event is coming up on Sunday, November 23; we'll have more details in our next newsletter.

In closing, I'd like to offer sincere thanks to the members of the Village's Senior Citizens Commission and Board of Health for their volunteer service to the community. With their roles now being performed by Village staff and other agencies, the Village has retired both bodies, but we remain grateful for the hard work and valuable guidance that our commissioners have provided through the years. Their contributions have made Wheeling safer, healthier, more inclusive, and more livable in numerous ways, and will endure for years to come.

New Utility Billing Lockbox Address

The remittance address for the Village of Wheeling utility billing lockbox changed on July 1, 2025. All payments should now be made to the following address:

A revised utility bill stub with the new address will be included in your bill, along with a window envelope for mailing.

As of October 1, 2025, the processing system currently used for lockbox services will be discontinued. For a short time after that, any payments received at the old lockbox address will be forwarded to the new lockbox in Carol Stream.

If you pay your utility bill online through your bank's bill pay service, please update the billing address with your bank as soon as possible to avoid rejected payments and potential late fees after October 1st.

All online payments through InvoiceCloud, including auto-pay/Wheeling direct payments, will continue functioning as usual and will not be affected by this address change.

Fire Prevention Week 2025: Charge into Fire Safety

The National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) has announced this year's theme for Fire Prevention Week October 5-11: "Charge into Fire Safety: Lithium-Ion Batteries in Your Home." This year's campaign works to educate everyone about using these batteries safely. The campaign stresses how important it is to BUY, CHARGE, and RECYCLE safely when it comes to lithium-ion batteries.

Charge into Fire Safety: 3 Steps

Buy only listed products. When buying a product that uses a lithium-ion battery, look for a safety certification mark such as UL, ETL, or CSA. This means it meets important safety standards.

Charge devices safely. Always use the cords that came with the product to charge. Follow the instructions from the manufacturer. Buy new chargers from the manufacturer or one that the manufacturer has approved. Charge your device on a hard surface. Don't overcharge your device. Unplug it or remove the battery when it's fully charged.

Recycle batteries responsibly. Don't throw lithium-ion batteries in the trash or regular recycling bins because they could start a fire. Recycle your device or battery at a safe battery recycling location. Visit call2recycle.org to find a recycling spot near you.

Back-to-School Safety Tips

As students head back to the classroom, let's work together to keep everyone safe!

For Students Walking to School:

- Always use sidewalks and crosswalks.
- Look both ways before crossing the street.
- Make eye contact with stopped drivers before crossing.
- Walk in groups when possible.

For Students Biking to School:

- Wear a properly-fitted helmet.
- Ride in the same direction as traffic.
- Obey all traffic signs and signals.
- Use hand signals and stay visible.

For Bus Riders:

- Arrive at the bus stop early.
- Stay back from the curb while waiting.
- Wait until the bus stops completely before boarding.
- Always cross in front of the bus, never behind it.

For Drivers:

- Slow down in school zones.
- Stop for school buses with flashing red lights.
- Be alert for children near crosswalks and intersections.
- Avoid distractions—put the phone down.

For Parents:

- Review drop-off and pick-up procedures.
- Talk to your kids about stranger safety.
- Make sure they know important phone numbers and how to call 911 in an emergency.

Guidelines for Leaf Disposal

Village Code 11.08.100 prohibits the deposit of leaves into streets, roads, or highways, and along the shoulder, curb, or edge of any street, road, or highway.

- Leaves intentionally raked into such areas can result in clogged storm sewer drains and subsequent flooding.
- The Village's contract with Waste Management provides an alternate, convenient method to dispose of leaves and other forms of yard waste for residents of single-family homes.
- In addition to two-ply Kraft biodegradable paper yard waste bags, residents may use rigid 32-gallon containers clearly marked with a red "X" around the container.
- Containers and biodegradable bags, when filled, may not exceed 50 pounds in weight. There is no limit to the number of yard waste bags or containers allowed.
- Yard waste in plastic bags or cardboard boxes will not be collected.
- Brush must be bundled and tied with biodegradable twine or string. Bundles must not weigh over 50 lbs., exceed four feet in length or two feet in diameter, or contain limbs greater than three inches in diameter. There is no limit to the number of brush bundles allowed.
- Loose or larger brush or logs will not be collected by Waste Management.
- Yard waste collections conclude on November 30, 2025.

Recycle Coach

Wheeling residents can access solid waste information through Recycle Coach, a free app that is available through desktop computers, laptops, and mobile devices.

Recycle Coach, a technology company in the field of waste management, partnered with the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency (IEPA) to provide residents with free access to a comprehensive tool to increase and improve recycling in communities. The app includes information from both the Village of Wheeling and the Solid Waste Agency of Northern Cook County (SWANCC).

The Recycle Coach provides:

- local recycling and disposal information
- customized curbside collection calendar including collection reminders
- disposal information for common and unique household items
- engaging and educational tools to boost recycling knowledge!



To get started, residents can download the Recycle Coach app through the Apple Store or Google Play, or visit www.wheelingil.gov/2233/Recycling-Coach for a QR code.

Storm Drain Grate/Inlet Cleaning

Storm drain grates/inlets are normally located near the edge of streets or in rear yards, collecting water which uses the storm sewer system to ultimately flow into streams, rivers, or lakes. Grates/inlets obstructed with leaves and other debris can deny constant water flow and can cause localized flooding. As leaves begin to fall, the Village encourages residents to safely clear storm sewer grates/inlets near their property to avoid local flooding issues. If a grate/inlet is obstructed, rake the debris off of the structure and onto the parkway or into a waste container. If ponding or another concern arises, contact Public Works 847.279.6900.

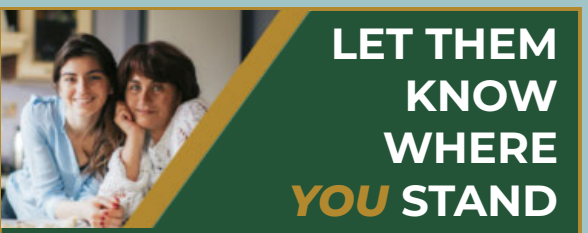

Floods Are No Myth: Be Prepared for the Unexpected

Discounts on flood insurance are just one of many benefits residents enjoy as a result of Wheeling's proactive approach to flood hazard damage reduction. A 47-year member of the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP), Wheeling has joined a national effort to minimize property damage in cases of flooding and provide affordable flood insurance to all homeowners, whether or not they are located in or near a floodplain. As part of its NFIP commitment, the Village provides a range of information on flooding potential, prevention, safety, and other issues. For more information about the NFIP and flood insurance, call 1.800.427.4661. Copies of the Flood Insurance Rate Maps (FIRMs) can be reviewed at the Village Hall and Indian Trails Public Library.

Local Flood Hazard Potential

The Village's proximity to waterways such as the Des Plaines River, Buffalo Creek, and McDonald Creek raises the hazard of flooding during heavy rains. Standard homeowner's insurance does not cover flooding. Through the 1960s, private rates on flood insurance were prohibitively high, which made it almost impossible to carry flood insurance. The NFIP, formed in 1968, is designed to subsidize the cost of flood insurance to member communities, qualify them to receive disaster relief, and establish minimum national standards to reduce flood losses.

High CRS Rating

One of eight inaugural NFIP communities in Illinois, Wheeling designed programs to exceed minimum standards and optimize benefits to Village residents. In 1992, the NFIP implemented the Community Rating System (CRS) to reward communities that go above and beyond the basic requirements. Effective May 1, 2014, our rating was upgraded to Class 6, which provides a 20% discount on flood insurance policies for properties located within the special flood hazard area. Policies issued for properties outside the special flood hazard area continue to receive a 5% discount. Wheeling continues to be proactive in preventative initiatives, including:

Stream maintenance: Regular inspections of waterways to ensure they are clear of debris and potential obstructions.

Regulating new construction: New buildings in the flood zone must meet requirements for elevation and flood-proofing. Village planners ensure that new developments don't increase flood risk for neighbors in the community.

Keeping residents informed of flood risk and how to minimize impact: Our residents must be aware of the potential for flooding. Tools such as this newsletter enable us to keep residents informed regarding the risk of flooding.

Development Regulated

Development of any type within special flood hazard areas is strictly regulated. In order to construct a building or an addition, perform any grading, or fill any other type of construction in these

areas, an individual must obtain a special "floodplain development permit." This permit is issued in conjunction with other construction permits to assure that the new construction will not be susceptible to flood damage or cause increased flood damage potential to neighboring properties. Floodplain development regulations can be found on the Village's website at www.wheelingil.gov in Title 22 of the Municipal Code (a link to which can be found on the home page) or by contacting the Engineering Division at 847.279.6910.

With flooding a possibility, preparation is the best defense. Safeguarding people, protecting buildings, and purchasing flood insurance are keys to defending against floods.

Protect Your Property: To flood-proof a structure, start by elevating or relocating electrical panel boxes, furnaces, water heaters, and washer/dryers to areas least likely to be flooded. Install basement floor drains and interior and exterior backwater valves. Consider erecting interior flood walls around utilities. Move essential items and furniture to the upper floors of your home. Keep materials such as sandbags, plywood, plastic sheeting, and lumber handy for emergency waterproofing. More flood protection information is available through the "Floodplain/Flooding Information" link on the home page of our website at www.wheelingil.gov. Information is also available for review at the Indian Trails Public Library.

Personal Safety: During periods of high water, stay out of the basement where breaker boxes and electrical wiring present the risk of shock. If you know high water is imminent, shut off the electricity, gas, and water. Keep your family together and make sure everyone has identification. Move everyone—including pets—to high ground. Rescue crews cannot reach you once the water becomes two feet deep. Don't drive across flooded roads where your vehicle could stall. Flowing water above your knees can generate dangerous currents; avoid walking through it.

Village Monitors Rising Water Levels: The Village monitors rising water levels with strategically placed gauges. Comparing data with historic records, the Village can predict areas of potential flooding. In the event of a flooding situation, Village staff is mobilized to notify people in affected areas. In some situations, notification may be made by phone. Road closure information is available from radio stations.

Overnight parking permits, vacation watch requests, and pet registry can all be found at www.frontlinepss.com/wheeling

Overnight Parking Permits

Parking on Village of Wheeling streets is prohibited between the hours of 2:00 a.m. and 6:00 a.m., or any time there are two or more inches of snow. If residents need to park a vehicle overnight, they must contact the Wheeling Police Department by phone at 847.459.2632 or submit a request using the online system. Requests must be received prior to 2:00 a.m.; any requests made after 2:00 a.m. may be subject to a parking citation. Each household is limited to a maximum of three total nights within a calendar month. For any special requests and/or requests beyond the limit, residents can contact the Wheeling Police Department at 847.459.2642 . Permission will not be granted for any type of recreational vehicles/trailers or commercial vehicles.

Vacation Watch Requests

Provide the details of your property and the date ranges you will be gone to the database. Once added, your property will be added to the Police Department's list of vacation watches for officers to check on, time permitting.

Pet Registry

Provide the Police Department with the details of your pet. Once added to the database, your pet's information will be available to the department in case of a lost or stolen pet.

Wheeling Conducts Special Census - Jobs Available!

Wheeling has experienced substantial development since the 2020 United States Census, leading to significant population growth. To ensure accurate representation and appropriate allocation of Local Government Distributive Funds and federal resources, we have requested a Special Census to be conducted by the U.S. Census Bureau starting in October 2025.

New residential communities such as One Wheeling Town Center, Uptown 500, London Crossing, and The Landings have contributed notably to this growth. The Special Census will focus on the census tracts that include and surround these developments. In accordance with Census Bureau policy, full census tracts will be recounted. This approach helps ensure stronger data protection, confidentiality, and accuracy. Residents in these areas are strongly encouraged to participate.

The process will mirror that of the decennial census, last completed in 2020. Residents will be able to respond online, or a Census Bureau representative may visit their home to collect information. All responses are strictly confidential and used solely for statistical purposes. No personal data will be shared by the U.S. Census Bureau with other government or law enforcement agencies.

To support the Special Census effort, temporary positions for Special Census Field Representatives (FRs) are available until September 30. These roles, offered by the U.S. Census Bureau, are paid federal positions and may be either full-time or part-time. FRs play a vital role in collecting census data and encouraging community participation. The Census Bureau will manage all hiring and provide full training. Interested individuals can apply through USAJobs.gov.

By accurately capturing the population increase, the Village could receive an estimated additional \$300,000 to \$400,000 annually in per capita revenues—including income tax, motor fuel tax, use tax, and cannabis use tax—through the 2030 decennial census.

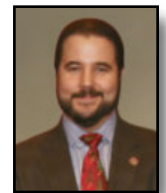
